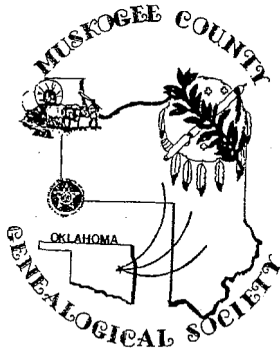

Americans – Who We Are

This column by Leonard Pitts Jr. was published in The Miami Herald on September 12 and has received an extraordinary response from readers worldwide.

When provoked by this level of barbarism, we will bear any suffering, pay any cost, in the pursuit of justice.

It's my job to have something to say.

They pay me to provide words that help make sense of that which troubles the American soul. But in this moment of airless shock when hot tears sting disbelieving eyes, the only thing I can find to say, the only words that seem to fit, must be addressed to the unknown author of this suffering.

You monster. You beast. You unspeakable bastard.

What lesson did you hope to teach us by your coward's attack on our World Trade Center, our Pentagon, us? What was it you hoped we would learn? Whatever it was, please know that you failed.

Did you want us to respect your cause? You just damned your cause.

Did you want to make us fear? You just steeled our resolve.

Did you want to tear us apart? You just brought us together.

Let me tell you about my people. We are a vast and quarrelsome family, a family rent by racial, social, political and class division, but a family nonetheless. We're frivolous, yes, capable of expending tremendous emotional energy on pop cultural minutiae -- a singer's revealing dress, a ball team's misfortune, a cartoon mouse. We're wealthy, too, spoiled by the ready availability of trinkets and material goods, and maybe because of that, we walk through life with a certain sense of blithe entitlement. We are fundamentally decent, though -- peace-loving and compassionate. We struggle to know the right thing and to do it. And we are, the overwhelming majority of us, people of faith, believers in a just and loving God.

Some people -- you, perhaps -- think that any or all of this makes us weak. You're mistaken. We are not weak. Indeed, we are strong in ways that cannot be measured by arsenals.

Yes, we're in pain now. We are in mourning, and we are in shock. We're still grappling with the unreality of the awful thing you did, still

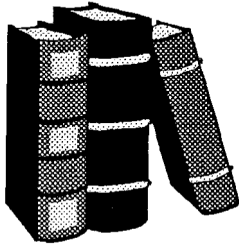

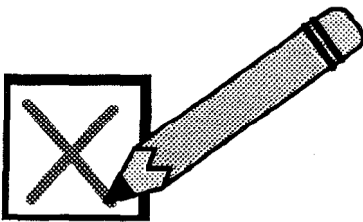

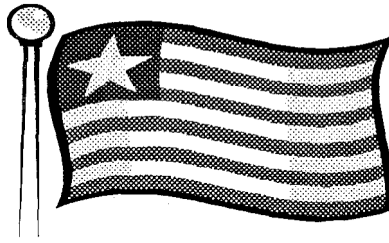

working to make ourselves understand that this isn't a special effect from some Hollywood blockbuster, isn't the plot development from a Tom Clancy novel. Both in terms of the awful scope of their ambition and the probable final death toll, your attacks are likely to go down as the worst acts of terrorism in the history of the United States and, probably, the history of the world. You've bloodied us as we have never been bloodied before.

But there's a gulf of difference between making us bloody and making us fall. This is the lesson Japan was taught to its bitter sorrow the last time anyone hit us this hard, the last time anyone brought us such abrupt and monumental pain. When roused, we are righteous in our outrage, terrible in our force. When provoked by this level of barbarism, we will bear any suffering, pay any cost, go to any length, in the pursuit of justice.

I tell you this without fear of contradiction. I know my people, as you, I think, do not. What I know reassures me. It also causes me to tremble with dread of the future.

In the days to come, there will be recrimination and accusation, fingers pointing to determine whose failure allowed this to happen and what can be done to prevent it from happening again. There will be heightened security, misguided talk of revoking basic freedoms. We'll go forward from this moment sobered, chastened, sad. But determined, too. Unimaginably determined.

You see, the steel in us is not always readily apparent. That aspect of our character is seldom understood by people who don't know us well.

On this day, the family's bickering is put on hold.

As Americans, we will weep; as Americans, we will mourn; and as Americans, we will rise in defense of all that we cherish.

So I ask again: What was it you hoped to teach us? It occurs to me that maybe you just wanted us to know the depths of your hatred. If that's the case, consider the message received. And take this message in exchange: You don't know my people. You don't know what we're capable of. You don't know what you just started. But you're about to learn.

MORDECAI OGLE AND DESCENDANTS

A record of Mordecai Ogel was found in the Roster of Ohio Soldiers in the War of 1812, Capt. Nicholas Davis' Co., Russell's Battalion. When a copy of the record was ordered from the National Archives, the name Ogle was found to be written Ogel and Ogal. Mordecai served from 26 August 1814 to ~~26 August~~ ^{14 March} 1815, as a substitute for one Thomas George. He went from Cadiz, Harrison Co., Ohio, to Detroit, Michigan, and returned. A marriage record was located in Harrison Co., Ohio, between Mordecai Ogle and Betsy Waninto (or Warrants - no record on that name yet), married 23 November 1815, recorded 4 January 1816. The 1820 census of Columbiana Co., city of Washington, Ohio, shows a Mordeca Ogle with two children under the age of ten. He was still at Washington in 1830 and by then had six children. He had land in Columbiana Co., then a patent to Mordecai Ogle in Richland Co., Ohio, in 1835. He sold this land in 1836 and moved to Fulton Co., Ill., where he bought land. There, Mordecai died between 30 November 1839, when he signed his will, and 11 Jan. 1840, when it was filed and recorded. Elizabeth Ogle is found on the 1840 census with five children. She married David Burgess on 5 June 1841. Of these, there is no further record at this time.

Mordecai was born between 1790 and 1794. In 1820 he was between the ages of 26 and 35. In 1830, he was between the ages of 30 and 40. He was about 24 in 1814 when he joined the militia. He and Betsy had nine children: **Jehu**, listed in the 1840 census at Waterford, Fulton Co., Ill., with one child under ten; **Isabel**, who married Amon Thompson; **Sally**, of whom I have no information; **Elizabeth**, who died, inasmuch as her land bequest was sold; **Mary Ann, Mordecai, Jr.**, and **Nancy**, who were minors in 1840; **William**, who ~~married and~~ moved to Elvaston, Hancock Co., Ill., where he died in 1889, after having married three times (Julia Ann Burgess, E. Keets, and Mary Sharpe); and **John (Johnathan)**, who married Jemima Servia Burgess and moved to Humboldt, Richardson Co., Nebraska, where he died.

Jehu Ogle, son of Mordecai, moved to Missouri, where he owned land and died in 1868. Jehu is listed as John, or appears as such on the 1850 Fulton Co., Ill., and 1860 De Kalb Co., MO., censuses. He married Ruth Eliot (Fulton Co., Ill. Marriage Record Vol. A, p. 54). No one knows for sure how Ruth's family spelled their name; this is the spelling found on the marriage record (others have used the spellings Elliot and Elliott). Jehu and Ruth had 11 children: **Eliza Jane**, b. 1840; **Benjamin Franklin "Frank"**, b. 1843; **Roseanna (Rose Ann)**, b. 1845; **Elisha Benton**, b. 1846; **Lucy A.**, b. 1848; **Josephine**, b. 1850; **Joanna**, b. 1855; **Samuel Elliott "Sam"**, b. 1857; **Steven Douglas "Doug"**, b. 1858, **Johnson A.**, b. 1860, and **Endora "Dora"**, b. 1864.

There is still much to learn about Steven Douglas Ogle. Census records show him as J. Douglas; however, a grandson listed him as Steven Douglas Ogle, and a death certificate of his son, Wilbert, showed his name as Steven Douglas Ogle. He was known as "Doug" Ogle by most family members. Doug was born in March 1858 at Maysville, De Kalb Co., Mo., per 1900 census. He always wanted to be a newspaper printer and is listed in the 1880

census as a printer. (Incidentally, his sister, Endora, is shown as a printeress in the same census.) Douglas Ogle married Clara A. M. Bennett, date and place unknown.

On 8 July 1898, Douglas wrote to his sister Rose Ann (Rosanna) Ellis from Long Lane, Dallas Co., Mo., stating he had 180 acres of land, but did not care for being a landlord. He wanted to trade for a printing press. The original letter was found in Rosanna's effects and given to me by her great-grandson, Charlie (R) Ellis of Casper, now of Buffalo, Wyo. The land he writes about is the land originally owned by Clara's father, William Henry Bennett. Records in the Missouri Historical Magazine list William Henry Bennett, Clara's father, as a wealthy and well-known advocate of early commune life. Her mother was Emma Wood Bennett. The remains of a log cabin are on this property; I have been there and taken photographs of it. A curious aspect of this visit to Long Lane is that about a mile away lived a girl that eventually moved to Oklahoma, and in 1902, Douglas' first child, Fred, married her.

One story that did surface was a news article about the editor (Doug Ogle) of the *Weatherby Magnet* in Missouri: "Household as well as office destroyed by fire." This article was found by cousin Charlie in Rosanna's Bible. Family tradition had it that the people who helped save some of the newspaper type helped to the point that not all was ever found.

Douglas' brother, Johnson, was reported to be a trouble maker and a drinker. Court records show he threatened to kill a man, or at least that man thought so. Perhaps Doug also drank, he was not a good manager, as land was sold by Clara and so was land inherited from his mother, Ruth.

Clara must have realized her health was not so good, and so asked Doug to move away from the bad influence of Johnson and the others. Clara died on 22 September 1900, after they moved to Oklahoma. She was laid to rest in the Pleasant Valley Cemetery, Sumner, Okla. A baby girl, Mable, was also laid to rest there. A stone put up by the Woodmen of the World ~~and~~ a tree stump form with fern decorating it marks her grave, along with a small square of marble nearby where Mable lies. Douglas later remarried. Douglas, his wife, Vila, and his youngest son, Rolla, were listed on the 1910 Caddo Co., Okla., census in Bridgeport. The *Bridgeport Grit* newspaper of 7 Jan. 1910, has an ad stating "Bread, pies, and cakes on hand at all times at the Restaurant. D. Ogle." Where Douglas died and is interred has not been found. (This is why questions should be asked properly of the older members of one's family. I did not question Aunt Ethel about where he died, so I lost out. I am hoping the 1920 census will help.)

Steven Douglas and Clara Ogle had nine children: **Fred, Roy, Wilbert, Earl, Cecil, Ethel, Clarence, Mable, and Rolla** (sometimes incorrectly referred to as **Riley**).

In Sept. 1882, the first of Douglas' nine children was born. His name was Fred Ogle (I do not know if he had other names). Fred married Rosa Bell Dean, the girl that lived about a mile from Long Lane, Mo., on 12 March 1902. Her sister had married and lived at Perry, Okla. When her parents died, Rosa came to Oklahoma riding a donkey. Since Fred lived at Perry, a few miles from where his mother, Clara, had died, and at Orlando, where Uncle Elisha Benton lived, he met Rosa. Even though he didn't have a job, Rosa consented to marry him. Rosa's sister moved to Claremore on a farm and Rosa went with her. There, in Claremore, is where Fred and Rosa married. Then moving to DeQueen, Ark., Fred bought land. He went to work in the oil fields in Smackover, Ark., and later into Colorado,

where he was killed in a car wreck at Rocky Ford.

Fred bought his first car in 1929, and he was killed in it. As the car came to rest on his head, he could not be identified absolutely, but a fellow worker stated it was Fred, and this fellow's mother wrote Rosa to that effect. She identified the body as Fred by his hands. His son, Oliver, never believed it to be his father. Rosa had told Fred as he was leaving to go to Colorado to work that that was the car he would be killed in, so one can speculate he could have decided to be "killed." A gruesome thought if someone died and he took advantage of the fact. Such things do occur. Though one would like to know where their family members lie, it is hard to suppose that could have happened. At all events, his grave is lost, for the daughter Ina and family never marked the grave.

Fred was sent home to Arkansas and buried at Fayetteville. At that time in 1930, the oldest child, a girl, lived there (why there, and not DeQueen, I don't know). The grave never had a stone and is now lost. Rosa left Arkansas in 1948 to care for her sister, Kate, who was going blind, and so lived in the town of Claremore, Okla. Rosa cared for Kate until Kate's death at age 93 in 1957. Kate was 16 years older than Rosa, so made an affidavit as to her birth when she applied for a Social Security card (I have a copy of that affidavit). I have a picture of Fred with his oil line crew. Fred also worked for the Arkansas Natural Gas Co., per another picture. He has his arms around a black dog in one picture. I also have a picture of all of Fred's children in my possession. (Ethel was the only living female in Douglas' family and Ina was the only girl in Fred's. I am the only girl my father had. Only one girl was born to another brother, Clarence.)

I don't know what happened to Fred's brothers, Cecil and Earl. Mable died young. Roy died in Kingsville, Texas. Clarence, a preacher, possibly died in Colorado. Wilbert became a preacher in his later years, after 20 years as a farmer. He died in Morning Sun, Iowa. After her mother's death, Ethel was raised by Doug's brother Elisha Benton and his wife, Mary. She was eight at the time. At 16, she married and went to seminary, and she and her husband became Methodist ministers. She preached until her 70's. She died in Tulsa, Okla. at the age of 87. Rolla spent most of his life in the Enid, Okla, home for handicapped children and was sent to a nursing home in 1964. How I wish I had known of him. My father, Paul, never knew he had an uncle living at that time. I have not found where Rolla died. Aunt Ethel looked after his care; I didn't know enough to ask the right questions and get this information from her. One learns to be smart too late.

Fred and Rosa Bell Ogle had five children: **Ina Mae, Paul Everet, Fred Clarence, Oliver Orine, and Edward Garrison.**

Fred's second child, Paul, didn't have much formal education. He loved horses and rode a lot. He went to Claremore to help his Aunt Kate and her husband Uncle Will Mayfield, living with them until Uncle Will died. He carried Uncle Will into the house when he collapsed in the yard. That is where Paul lived when he met Bonnie Sarah Davis, who lived just down the road from Aunt Kate. After Paul and Bonnie were married, they lived with Aunt Kate. Bonnie stated that one night she woke to find someone standing at the foot of the bed. She could not move nor wake Paul to tell him. Then as she watched, the man she assumed was Will went back across the room and through the wall. She had never met Uncle Will. (In 1987, when she was very ill in the hospital, she spoke to her brother, thinking he was Uncle Will, saying, "I thought I'd never get to meet you.") Paul and Bonnie moved to DeQueen, Ark., then to Texas, where Bonnie's family had come from. Their first

son, Paul E., Jr., was born in Claremore, Okla., and the second son, Earl Dean, was born in Texas. The third child, myself, was born two days after the oldest son died from diphtheria. The second son had it, but the doctor who came to tend to my birth, Dr. Gordon, cured him and saved his life.

The son of this Dr. Gordon, who tended my birth in 1932, tended me when I had my daughter in 1952. I was born in Foyil, Okla., a few miles north of Claremore where my daughter was born. Though these events occurred in the same vicinity, I have traveled over many states since I came into this old world, living and going to school, a different one nearly every year, in Texas, Arkansas, Kansas, Texas, Arizona, Oregon, Missouri, Texas, and graduating in Oklahoma.

Paul was a farmer, laborer, cotton ginner, fruit orchard worker, wheat combiner, and dairy worker. He had a hernia which was never corrected. One of his favorite acts was with horses. He could do a head stand on a horse while it was moving. Even though he should not have lifted heavy weights, he prided himself on doing that very thing. Paul did not keep in touch with his father's brothers, but he did have some contact with Aunt Ethel

When Paul and Bonnie went from Oklahoma to Texas the first time, they traveled by wagon, returning to Oklahoma the same way. After I was born, they went back to Texas again in a wagon. Paul had not yet learned to drive a car.

The youngest of Fred's sons, Edward, was the only son to complete high school and attain a higher education. He became an airman, serving in the China-Burma Theater during World War II, with the rank of Major. After the war, he remained in the active reserves and became a lawyer in Washington, D. C.

Fred's daughter, Ina, completed high school and college where she met her husband, Guy Lucas. They moved from Fayetteville, Ark. to Baltimore, Md. She worked as a secretary, and he was in the finance department of the Civil Service.

Paul and Bonnie Ogle had four children: **Paul Everett, Jr., Earl Dean, Bonnie Delores, and Edward Gerald.**

I was the only one of my siblings to finish high school, then take some college courses, going into the Civil Service with the Veteran's Medical Center, Muskogee, Okla. This came after my divorce from Bobby David Nickerson, leaving me to raise my daughter alone,

My parents, Paul and Bonnie Ogle, had a fourth child, Edward Gerald, born in Arkansas when I was seven. He went into the Army at age 17, completed his education, and served two tours in Germany and in Vietnam. He met his wife, Renata Elizabeth Freise, in Germany; his oldest boy and girl were born in Germany during his tours there. He was a career man of 20 years. He is now working in the Civil Service near Jacksonville, Florida. His two girls and two boys are all tall, at least six feet. The oldest girl and oldest boy are both in the service of their country.

My daughter Nila has four children: **William Doherty, and Stephanie, Kimberly, and David Van Schuyver.** The two girls are married and have two children each. A picture of Nila when she was a baby shows one grandfather, two grandmothers, three great-grandmothers; three sets of four generations. Now I am a great-grandmother, the sixth generation of the Mordecai Ogle line. Jarreth Mooneyham was the first of the ninth generation in 1990.

In reviewing these generations, I note that Betsy gave Mordecai nine children, Ruth

gave Jehu eleven children, Clara gave Doug ten children, Rosa Bell gave Fred five children, Bonnie gave Paul four children, and I had only one. Nila had four children, and Stephanie and Kim each had two. The number of cousins is in the hundreds, but only a few are known. *Three David has!*

Recently, on the 1920 census Soundex, I found a Doug Ogle, living alone at Perry, Okla., back near Sumner, where Clara died and is buried and near where Elisha Benton Ogle lived at Orlando. Douglas is listed as a compositor for a printing office. Hurrah! I finally found my great-grandfather's place of death. And then again, maybe I didn't. There is no record of him being buried in the Perry Cemetery.
