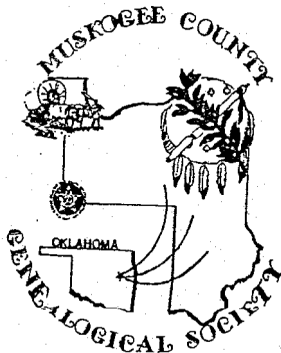

Susan, Allen, deposes and says:

My name is Susan Allen. My age is 28 years. I am the eldest one of the family. We have always lived in Indian Territory in Tahlequah and Coo-wee-sooo-wee Districts. I claim 3/4 Cherokee, and the others full-blood. I do not have my Cherokee Roll No. with me. That is the way the Dawes Commission enrolled us. Katy Cannon #4374. and Penia Manley #4376. We were enrolled for the grass and strip payment. We get our Indian blood from both sides. Peggy Hammer married a Rogers. He is dead. Has been dead about five years. She was enrolled by the Dawes Commission. Mother was about 42 years old. She was born and raised here, but was a year old at the time the war broke out. She got her blood from both sides. I don't know her parents names. Joshua Ross that James Hammer was my grandfather on my mother's side. I don't know my grandmother on mother's side. Loony Hammer is a half-brother to my mother. He lives at Muskogee. A sister Lizze Duvall, by a different father. My mother's parents were married by the laws they used to have. Gabe Rogers was my father. He claimed 3/4 Cherokee. He was enrolled for the strip money also by the Dawes Commission. He is living and is about 60 years old. I don't think he was enrolled in 1851. I do not know why we was not enrolled in 1851, if he was not. I think he got it from both sides too. His mother was Louisa Rogers, and his father's name Will Rogers. They lived in the Cherokee Nation. I think they were all born here. I don't know which one left the Eastern States. My grandmother on my mother's side was not a slave. None of us are on the Freedman Roll. My father has a sister in The Saxon Fox country. My mother's people were regarded as Old Settlers. They were all old settlers, - father's side too. I don't know what time they came here. Some were Emigrants and some were Old Settlers. My mother's mother's people were Old Settlers. My mother's father and his people were Emigrants. My father and his people were Old Settlers. I do not know any brothers and sisters of my grandparents. James Hammer lived in Canadian District. He was enrolled in Illinois District I have been told by Joshua Ross, 234.

Samuel Smallwood being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

That I am about 28 years of age. My father was about 25 years old when he died. My mother was about 20 or 25 years old when she died. Both of my parents were full blood Cherokees. De-ye-nuh was the grandfather. Smallwood was his English name. Don't know De-yoh-nuh's wife's name. He was living in the west in 1851. The grandfather on my mother's side was John Kettle in English, and in Indian it was John Te-yo-han-nuh. He sometimes called himself John Juh-hu-tan. My father's brother Joe was the oldest. Ta-gah-suh-quah-luh was his Indian name. Johnson Smallwood was the next brother. His Indian name was John-sin or Johnson. My father came next. Tobacco Smallwood came next. His Indian name was Chal-che-luh. Martha was a sister of my mother. She married a man named Veaver. Her Indian name was Dah-cah-skih. Ma-lih was another sister. Her English name was Mollie. Ailsey was another sister. She is the only one living and she lives at Webbers Falls, Okla. Her name is Ailsey Veaver. Lucy Davis was the next one. Her Indian name was Lu-oih. Don't think any of my mother's sisters or my mother were living in 1851. They were born after that time. Don't know any of the brothers and sisters of either of my grandparetns. De-yoh-nah is the uncle of the father of Malinda Sunday (19049). I am enrolled by the Dawes Commission and my number is 17097. My brother William's number is 5127. My mother and William's mother were sisters.

Only three issues of the *Keefton American* newspaper are known to exist. These are extracts from the first two issues. The next issue will contain additional abstracts of Keefton news abstracted from this newspaper.

1905 September 8

Joel Hobbs was appointed overseer of the "West" road. (p. 1, c. 2)

At the conclusion of the road business the Commercial Club meeting adjourned and the meeting resolved itself into a citizens meeting, and A. M. Dalring was chosen chairman, and in a few well chosen remarks announced we were open for school business. (p. 1, c. 2)

She will return to her home this week to prepare for moving to God's country. In the mean time the American will keep her in touch with the doings in her future home. (p. 1, c. 2)

Theo. Jones, [of] Pine Bluff, Ark., has been appointed bookkeeper for LaFayette & Bro., assuming his position Friday. (p. 1, c. 2)

M.J. Maples, 74 year old Pioneer resident of Oklahoma died Saturday afternoon at Marysville, Calif. according to word received here yesterday by relatives.

A sudden heart attack caused the death of the aged man. He came to Indian Territory in 1890 and settled at the frontier village of Webbers Falls. He lived there and at Warner for 34 years.

Six years ago he moved to California where nearly all his family is now living. A daughter, Mrs. W.C. Haley, lives in Muskogee at 717 East Broadway. S.C. Maples, a son, reside in Tulsa.

Funeral Services and burial will be held in California.

DEATH OF JUDGE STIDHAM

After a brief illness of only a few days duration, George Washington Stidham departed this life at his home near Eufaula Saturday morning last at 6 o'clock. Surrounded by his family, death came peacefully and calmly and the life went out from one, who, for a half century past, had been a conspicuous figure in the history of the Creek Nation.

He was born in the old Alabama reservation in November 1817, and came to the Indian Territory with the first delegation of Creeks in 1832. During a life of 74 years he witnessed and was a conspicuous figure in the many transformations that have taken place in this country. He first held an office of public trust under old Muskogee government in 1836 and almost constantly since that time had been in some form or other a servant of his people. After the new government was formed at the close of the late war, he was elected Chief Justice of the Creek Nation, which he held at the time of his death. He devoted himself, his labor and capital to the elevation of the Creek Indians and was loved and honored by his countrymen and respected by all who came in contact with him. Up almost to the time of his death he was actively engaged in pressing claims justly due to the Creeks, and as a delegate to Washington at the last session of congress, he secured an appropriation to pay just claims long since due.

Not only at home among his own people was judge Stidham known and esteemed. His circle of acquaintances in Washington and elsewhere was large and many a friend in the east will drop a tear when they learn of the death of the venerable Creek statesman. His aim in life was the elevation of his people, and as long as there is a Creek people, his example will be emulated by their sons and daughters. Naturally he inherited prejudices but they were well grounded and it can be truthfully said of him that he exerted his energy to secure that elevation of his people which would ultimately fit them for the responsibilities and privileges of American citizenship. He lived long enough to see his work bearing fruit.

Judge Stidham was the oldest Scottish Rite Mason in the Indian Territory at the time of his death. He was the first master of the Muskogee Lodge in 1855 and was for four terms Grand Treasurer of the Grand Lodge. He served faithfully and with profit to the craft in every position he held.

The funeral services were held at Eufaula Sunday, at the M.E. Church, Rev. Mr. Yarborough delivering the funeral sermon. It was one of the largest funerals ever held in the Indian Territory. The Grand Lodge of the Indian Territory, assisted by South Canadian and Eufaula Lodges, buried their departed brother with all Masonic honor. All that was mortal of George Washington Stidham was laid to rest in the village cemetery near the place he had lived so long, there to await the great awakening.
