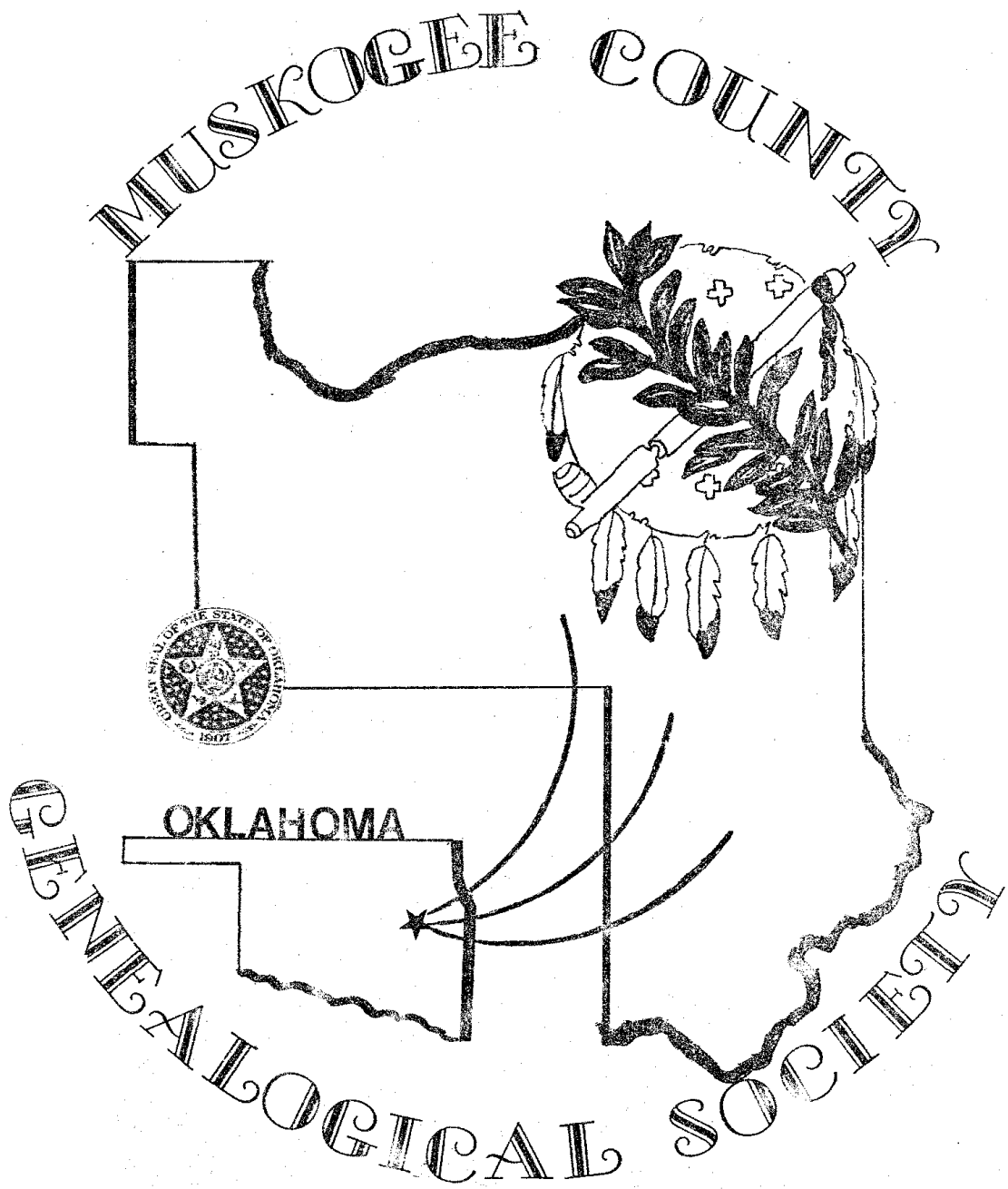

Muskogee, Indian Territory, October 19th,....

At Fort Gibson last evening, by the Rev. Mr. Stoddard, Miss Cora Ross, daughter of William P. Ross, principal chief of the Cherokee Nation, was married to R.B. Howard, of Maryland.

The bridesmaids were Emma Ross, a sister of the bride, and Miss Alice Ross, a cousin escorted by Messrs. Nash and Burns.

The bridal party received the congratulations of their friends at the residence of Chief Ross. The beautiful grounds were illuminated by Chinese lanterns. The ample rooms were tastefully decorated with flowers and evergreens and presided over with grace and dignity by the accomplished Mrs. Ross, the wife of the Chief.

The guest numbering nearly one hundred, included the officers of Company J. fifth Calvary, now stationed at the Fort, their ladies, and the elite of the nation, and were regaled with a supper composed of the delicacies of the season. The Confections were unsurpassed.

Choice bouquets of flowers from the conservatories of St. Louis, added beauty and fragrance to the scene. Music and dancing lent their share for the evening, making the scene of enjoyment complete.

The beauty of the bride and her fair associates, the elegant attire and style of the lady guests, the charming ease and hospitality of Mr. and Mrs. Ross, made it the most recherche affair every witnessed in the Indian Territory.

Mr. R.B. Howard is not of Maryland, but a Benton county boy, born and bred, we believe, in Bentonville, and is a brother of Mr. Mark Howard, who recently made the rich discovery in Nevada. Old Maj. Howard the father of the boys, is one of Benton's oldest citizens, and has been a practicing lawyer in our courts for the last 35 or 40 years.

We congratulate him on the "big Soonzas" recently the good fortune of his two boys.

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The following notation was made by M.T. Sloan: The date of this marriage which has been copied from the original clipping-- now in the possession of, or rather pasted in the scrap book of Aunt Ida. Mrs. R. C. ## Tracing an Ancestor to England

Arden H. Brame Jr. II, OAE

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How does one go about tracing an ancestor back to England? Well, in more recent times you can check the civil registration indexes on microfilm at the LDS Temple Genealogy Library, or you can make the difficult search for naturalization records or not quite so difficult search of passenger lists (if year and port of entry is known. Remember that the 1900 census contains year of immigration when applicable).

In some ways, colonial ancestral immigrants are easier to trace back across the Atlantic to England. I will use my Peter Montague (1604-1659) who immigrated to Virginia in 1621 on the Charles as an example of how I traced an immigrant back first to landed gentry, then to nobility, and finally to multitudes of nobility and royalty.

1. I checked the Family Group Record Archives, Main Section (FGRA) at the Genealogical Society Library in Salt Lake City and found FGRA's for Peter, his father (also Peter) and his grandfather William. William Montague married a Margaret Malthouse (Malthus), relative of the Thomas Robert Malthus of Malthusian Theory fame. On the FGRA, it gives her father as John Malthouse\* (the asterisk indicates that there is an FGRA on him too). On the John Malthouse FGRA, it shows that his wife Margaret Bullock's father was Thomas Bullock, and I further find that Thomas Bullock's father is Gilbert Bullock, who married a Margaret Norris, whose father was Sir William Norris. By the way, each FGRA sheet gives one or more, usually several sources, where the information for the FGRA was obtained and by following up on these, you can eventually get to the original source records.

2. For the Malthus (sometimes Malthouse) the FGRA referred me to John O. Payne's 1890 book Collections for A History of the Family of Malthus and the Bullock FGRA's of both Thomas and Gilbert listed the Rev. Llewellyn C. W. Bullock's 1905 Memoirs of the Family of Bullock of Berkshire, Essex and Other Counties. I then ordered a xerox copy of the Malthus book from the Library of Congress at 30 cents per page and found the Bullock book on microfilm at the Los Angeles Public Library where I was able to make photocopies for 25 cents per page of pertinent pages.

The materials are available--you just have to know where to look.

I have shown how I got my immigrant ancestor Peter Montague back to one of his 4th great-grandparents, Sir William Norris (1433-1506). The most important key person in the lineage I have been leading up to and am about to relate, is the wife of Sir William Norris of Yattendon and Bray, Berkshire.

The Bullock book mentioned this illustrious lady but did not indicate that she was the mother of my Margaret Norris who married Gilbert Bullock. The proof I needed was found in the (Herald's) Visitations of Berkshire (Harleian Society, vol. 55, 10, for 1531/2 and vol. 57, 184-186, for 1665/6) which showed Margaret Norris to be the daughter of Lady Joan (or Jane) de Vere (daughter of the 12th Earl of Oxford). The reason it was critical to prove the mother of Margaret Norris is that her father married three times: (1) Lady Joan de Vere (died between 1465 and 1471); (2) Isabel Ingaldesthorpe (died 20 May 1476), widow of John Nevill, Marquess of Montague and Knight of the Garter, and (3) Anne Horne, and he had children by all three (six by the 1st, three by the 2nd, and five by the 3rd). As a general rule, the Herald's Visitations are considered valid for three generations from the person who provided the information.

The reason I know that Peter Montague (1604-1659) came from Boveny, Buckinghamshire, was the fact that George William Montague in his History and Genealogy of Nansemond and Lancaster Counties, Virginia and his Descendants (1621-1894) published in 1894, presents a Montague pedigree chart copied from the (Herald's) Visitation of the County of Buckingham, made in 1534--and later published by the Harleian Society, vol. 53, 92-93, in 1909, in which Peter Montague is shown as "Now in Virginia, 1634". The book shows Peter Montague (1604-1659) to be the son of Peter Montague and Eleanor Allen--but the Harleian Society rendition gives George Montague and Susan Norris as his parents. Additional confusion exists because it has been shown (though overlooked) that there were two Peter Montagues in Virginia, Peter Montague (the son of George) who immigrated to Jamestown in 1621 and who was Burgess representing Nansemond County in 1652 and 1653 and Peter Montague (the son of Peter and nephew of George), first known to be in Virginia in 1650 and who was Burgess for Lancaster County in 1657-8. This latter Peter was my ancestor.

Additional search of Boveny, Burnham and Dorney Parish Records, Court Records, and the like are required to shed more light on the Montague family (unfortunately, there are large gaps in the Boveny Church Records).

If you are working with English ancestors, you will want to become familiar with and use the books by Marshall, Whitmore and Barrow.

1. The Genealogist's Guide by George W. Marshall, 1903 (covers the period from about 1500 to 1903 of published and manuscript sources).
2. A Genealogical Guide by John B. Whitmore, 1953

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(covers the period from 1903 to 1950, including references that Marshall had missed in the earlier period).

The Genealogist's Guide by Geoffrey B. Barrow, (ST7 (covers the period from 1950 to 1975 and includes some references omitted by both Marshall and Whitmore for the earlier periods).

These three books include an alphabetical arrangement by surnames of pedigrees and family histories appearing in virtually all published English family histories, pedigrees, herald's visitations, local and county histories, historical and antiquarian societies, and various genealogical periodicals, etc. The value of these three books to the genealogist is extraordinary. I use them constantly and it was Marshall and Whitmore particularly that led me to the various visitations I needed on Montague, Bullock and Norris. The Los Angeles Public Library (LAPL) Genealogy Room has them all on their reference (index) table, as does The Augustan Society Library. If you have English ancestors, then by all means become aware of and use these three volumes.

If you descend from an English ancestor who immigrated to the United States after 1850 or so, then you may find him or her in the (annual, arranged by quarters) Civil Registration Indexes to births, marriages and deaths from mid-1837 to 1903 or 1906, the microfilms of which are at the Genealogical Society Library (and available at branches), or you can order a complete copy of the original certificate direct from the:

Each certificate must be paid for and air postage is extra (write for current cost).

What do you do if you need records prior to mid-1837? You must locate the church parish of your ancestor and then the parish records of baptisms, marriages, or/and burials, and this is where the CFI (Computer File Index of the LDS Church) can be of tremendous aid. As of August 1978 the CFI had 46 million names in it of which over half were of England and Wales, predominantly abstracted from the church parish records.

English parish records began in 1538 and are most valuable up to the start of the mid-1836 Civil Registrations. Unfortunately, especially for the earlier years, not as many parish records exist as we would like.

Wills can be of immense aid genealogically in England too and especially so if the needed parish records are missing. English wills date back to the 14th century and those of more prominent people with property in more than one probate district (or who died abroad) were centrally located in two courts up to 1857:

Wills of the more common people prior to 1858 (those who held property in only one probate district) were recorded in the various Archdeacon's Courts and Peculiar Courts. If you know the parish of your ancestor, then you can check:

Most of the pre-1858 wills and indexes as well as administrations are on microfilm at the great LDS Genealogical Society Library in Salt Lake City, and can be borrowed on loan via any local LDS Branch Genealogical Library. A rough listing of the probate records at Salt Lake City is given in Part III of:

The Genealogical Handbook for England and Wales. Comp. by Joseph Hall, 1977.

Other English records include Inquisitiones Post Mortem (IPM=Inquiries After Death), and these date from the 1200s to 1660 and are similar to petitions for probate in this country. IPMs are often very valuable to the genealogist, as in my researches: Sir William Norris (1433-1506) married three times and several published works, including the famous Directory of National Biography, incorrectly assigned various of his fourteen children to the wrong wives. The IPM for the 2nd wife of Sir William Norris (Isabel Ingaldesthorp, "late the wife of William Norreys, knt., and sometime the wife of John Neville, Marquess Montagu"), is partially published on page 95 in "The Calendar of Inquisitiones Post Mortem... preserved in the Public Record Office... Henry VII", Vol. I (1898), that IPM, the following firmly establishes the children of Sir William Norris by Isabel Ingaldesthorp



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(Nevill):

Writ wanting: inq. before Thomas Sampson, esq., escheator, 21 Oct., 16 Edw. IV (=16th year of the reign of Edward IV which is 21 October 1476) She was seised in fee of the under-mentioned manors, &c., and took to husband one Willia : Norreys, kn., and they were seised thereof in fee in her right; and she had issue by him, William, Alice, and Joan....

The Calendar of Inquisitiones Post Mortem in published book form exists for the period of 1216 to 1307 (14 volumes) and 1485 to 1509 (reign of Henry VII) in 3 volumes; and there is an index of IPMs for the period of 1509 to 1649 (P.R.O. Lists and Indexes, nos. 23, 26, 31 and 32), 4 volumes. (For the searcher in the Southern California area, these are all in the library of the University of California at Los Angeles.) "The First Annual Brigham Young University Family History and Genealogical Research Seminar Course Syllabus, 1978", contains an excellent discussion of IPM (pages 130-135). In fact, there is good coverage of all kinds of British records (pages 57-99) and English and Welsh records (pages 101-135). The syllabus is available at the LDS Branch Libraries for \$6.00.

**Manorial Records:** These are comprised largely of Court Rolls (later called Court Books), that are the minutes kept of the manorial courts and date from the 13th to the 19th century. Many collections of manorial rolls are yet in private hands and the staff at each of the County Record Offices should know their location, if they don't have them. Or, you can contact:

where the Manorial Documents Register is maintained.

A Manorial Record often includes the important business of registering a change of ownership of manorial land, or a death may be reported and the heir established, and this may be accompanied by an extract from a will. Unfortunately, Manorial Records were written in Latin (an easy form) until the middle of the 18th century, except for the period of Cromwell's usurpation, when they were ordered kept in English. There are no indexes to help. You can often locate the manors of your more prominent ancestors in the Victoria County Histories (complete sets in the Los Angeles Public Library and UCLA Research Library). My Montagues, for example, were of Boveny Parish and Boveny Manor, Buckinghamshire. One of my top priority projects is to determine if Boveny Manorial Records are in existence.

**Lay Subsidies:** like the Inquisitiones Post Mortem, Feet of Fines, Close Rolls, and Charter or Patent Rolls, the Lay Subsidies are also under the Exchequer Records housed at the PRO:

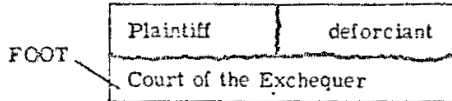
and can be researched in the PRO "Round Room".

Lay Subsidies are the returns of nationwide taxes levied at irregular intervals when the monarch was in special need of money and these tax records are not confined to the wealthy. One of the most useful Lay Subsidies is that of King Henry VIII, who imposed them in 1524 and 1525. This magnificent series for rural parishes, apart from some gaps, should give a nearly complete picture of heads of households except for the very poor in towns who were spared assessment. There are also nearly complete Subsidy Returns for 1327 to 1332, during the first years of Edward III's reign. Earlier Subsidies during the reigns of Edward I and Edward II exist for between 1292 and 1327 but are incomplete for large portions of England as are those during the reigns of Elizabeth I and James I. A number of counties have had their section of the earliest Lay Subsidies printed (1292-1332). It would certainly be useful to have a complete nationwide index developed for the 1524-25 and 1327-32 Lay Subsidies.

**Feet of Fines:** This series of documents begin in 1182, are written in Latin until 1733, and were used only until 1834. Only the "foot" of each parchment

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document was preserved by the Exchequer: the top two pieces being divided between the plaintiff and deforciant (=contracting parties).



Feet of Fines take the place of land deeds (as do the Close Rolls, see below) and are records of lawsuits heard to settle who owned property. Names, places and the relationships are given and many are in the Public Record Office, in the Court of Common Pleas series. Since the indexes or calendars are so poor, these records are not often used by genealogists, but they can be very valuable as they often mention several members of a family.

**Close Rolls:** The most important records relating to property in addition to the Feet of Fines are the Close Rolls, which contain thousands of deeds of sale. They are in roll form and of tremendous length, each roll consisting of many deeds each sewn to the previous one as it was copied. As one unrolls in one direction, you must keep rolling at the other end so as not to entangle the other researchers at the Public Record Office. The Close Rolls also run from the 12th to the 19th century and can be seen in the Round Room of the Public Record Office. There are 65 printed volumes of Close Rolls (1204 to 1509) at the UCLA Research Library and two series from 1574 to 1586 (Grantors) and 1461 to 1848 (Grantees) on microfilm at the Genealogical Society Library in Salt Lake City.

**Protestation Return of 1642:** All males over the age of eighteen who subscribed to the Oath of Protestation, and a few of those who refused to subscribe, are included in the Protestation Returns of 1642. This is a very comprehensive set of personal names of males who were required to give their oath of allegiance to the Crown and the Protestant religion. A number of counties have had their own sections printed or photocopied and they may be seen in their record offices. The rolls or returns give names only, but being arranged by parishes and also indexed, they can be very useful for locating families.

**Hearth Tax:** This tax was in force beginning in 1662 and is particularly valuable up to 1674. A payment of two shillings on every hearth in a house (except poor people and churches) was required. This was a very unpopular tax as it touched the poorer people who had not been directly taxed for several hundred years (not since the Poll Tax returns of 1377, 1379, and 1381). This tax included most classes of people and so serves as a "census" for most householders. The Records are arranged by county, then by Hundred and Parish. There is a list of Hearth Taxes and Lay Subsidy Rolls by county for those that have been printed (with indexes) in John West's book,

**Village Records.** It would certainly be a splendid project to have the complete Hearth Tax returns indexed.

**Poll Tax Returns 1377 to 1381:** These taxes were levied on all subjects above the ages of 14 and 15 except for the very poor, and are, therefore, almost a census of the population during that period. However, their detail and completeness vary considerably and they are hard to interpret in places. County divisions of hundreds were used with a separate listing for each parish. Then people were categorized under farmers, craftsmen, laborers, and servants, the name of each person being given and the amount of tax paid.

**Apprentice Records 1710-1811:** Apprentices were bound by a legal agreement to serve and learn a trade and were made in at least two copies. The normal age of apprentices began at 14 years of age. The documents or indentures contained the name of the apprentice, quite often the name of his (or her) father, occupation chosen (father's occupation), place of residence, name of master and his occupation and place of residence. The indexes to Apprentice Records 1710-1774 are available at the Genealogical Society Library in Salt Lake City, microfilm numbers 477.624 to 477.637 and the Apprentice Records 1710-1811 (73 volumes) are also there, microfilm numbers 674.622 to 674.634 and 638.740 to 638.750 and 641.631.

I have tried to give you a good variety of sources of English records for getting your ancestor located in England and then tracing their ancestors back. Some books that may help connect your American immigrant colonists back to their English home locality and which might possibly contain your ancestor are:

The said Catherine MONTAGUE was the child of Peter MONTAGUE (III) born Nansemond Co, Virginia about 1633, died Middlesex Co, Virginia before 1695, married before 1665 Mary MINOR, born ?Holland, about 1640, died Middlesex Co, Virginia before 1695.

The said Peter MONTAGUE (III) was the child of Peter MONTAGUE (II) born at Boveny, Buckinghamshire, 1604, died Lancaster Co, Virginia between 27 March to 1 July 1659, first wife unknown;

The said Peter MONTAGUE (II) was the child of Peter MONTAGUE (I), born Boveny, Buckinghamshire, about 1578, died (?) Boveny, married about 1600 Eleanor ALLEN, born Burnham, Buckinghamshire about 1580, died (?) Boveny;

The said Peter MONTAGUE (I) was the child of William MONTAGUE, born (?) Boveny, about 1550, died at Boveny 1593, married about 1575 to Margaret MALTHOUSE (MALTHUS), christened Binfield, Berkshire 15 February 1556/9, died at Boveny;

The said Margaret MALTHOUSE (MALTHUS) was the child of John MALTHOUSE, born Binfield, Berkshire,

about 1525, died at Binfield after November 1558, married about 1549 Margaret BULLOCK, born at Arborfield, Berkshire about 1529, died (?) Binfield;

The said Margaret BULLOCK was the child of Thomas BULLOCK born at Arborfield about 1485, died there between 8 August 1557 and 23 February 1558, married about 1510 to Alice KINGSMILL, who was born at Easingstoke, Hampshire about 1490, died at Arborfield;

The said Thomas BULLOCK was the child of Gilbert BULLOCK born Arborfield, about 1450, died there 1500, married about 1475 Margaret NORRIS, born Yattenden, Berkshire about 1455, died at Arborfield perhaps in 1512;

The said Margaret NORRIS was the child of Sir William Norris born at Bray, Berkshire 1433, died at Yattenden 4 January 1507, married about 1453 to Jane de VERE, born at Hedingham Castle, Essex about 1436, died at Yattenden 1465 to 1471;

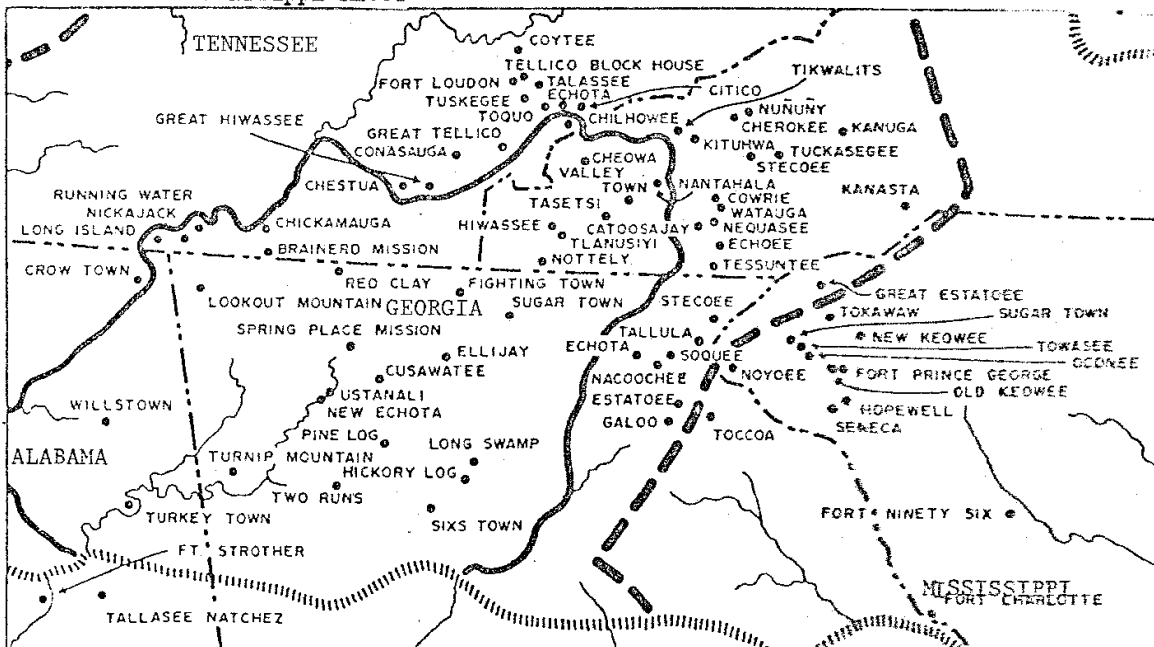
