

Dear Members,

The Muskogee Public Library Board agreed at their December meeting that they would purchase the 1900 & 1910 Soundex(Miracode) and the 1900 & 1910 Census for Oklahoma, at a cost of \$2083.88. They then ask the Muskogee County Genealogical Society if they could raise \$414.00 to help in the purchase of the above material. At our December meeting we voted and agreed to take \$125.00, from our funds and members would make donations to obtain the rest. As of this time we still need donations to reach this goal. The \$414.00 will purchase 10 rolls of the 1900 Census, and 36 rolls of the 1910. The library feels that this material is necessary for them to answer the request for Census information, averaging 15-20 per week, or 3-4 per day. Mational Archives and Records Service now requires A new request form to be used when order veterans records.

The new forms -NATE Form 80- is required for Pension files, Bounty band Warrant Files & Military Ser-Vice records. Only one search will be made per form. New rules also apply for payment of the photocoples. The form is submitted with the request for one of the above files, including all the information you have on the veteran. If a file is found the form is returned to you with a request for a fee of \$5.00 to be sent, (These copies will only be held for 30 days.) you will also return the form with your payment. The Archives asks you to allow 8-10 weeks for processing. To order these forms write: Reference Services Branch(NNIR) National Archives and Records Services, 8th and Pennsylvania Ave, N.W. away shortly after I was born. I'm told there is a group in Tulsa for adopted people who want to find their real parents, Can you help me?" Mrs. C.Y.Tulsa. Answer:

The Tulsa group is called Adult Adoptees, formed in 1974 by people in you situation. Its adress is ADULT ADOPTEES, care of June Hill, 4952 E. 4th Place, Tulsa, Ok 74112. When you write include a self-addressed, stamped envelope.

Since you were born in Oklahoma, it can help if you find a district court judge willing to issue a court order to the State Health Department's vital records section ordering it to make you birth records available to you. Being adopted, you will have two birth certificates-one listing your real name and natural parents' names, and another made out to your adopted parents listing your adopted name. The group hasn't had much success in finding a Tulsa judge willing to issue such orders, but others outside of Tulsa have done so in the past.

The group charges nothing for its assistance, but getting a court order to open your records usually costs you plenty in attorney fees. You must be 21 or older to receive the groups help, and when youwrite for assistance, include as much information as you have about your history.


TRACING GERMAN AND BY THROUGH HAMBURG. (Article Submitted by Louise Simpson-From New York Times News Service- 1984)

Thanks to modern methods of information retrieval, tracing ancestry is becoming easier. As an example take the Museum for Harburg story, where Germany's first Historic Brie ration Office has just been opened. There, visitors from North America can journey into the past, with the aid of microfilm files th at store nearly five million rares in a record of emigration from 1850-1914.

Hamburg was a major European port of embarkation for emigrants to the New World from many parts of Europe. Cerman Immigration to America began 301 years ago. According to the Census Bureau, one in every four Americians has German ancestors.

At the Historic Emigration Office in Hamburg, visitors who provide their forefather's name and-as best they can-year of emigration will enable trained researchers to find the name of the ship that carried the enigrant and the date of departure. Results will be printed on an official certificate carrying the emigrants name and such personal data as age, occupation, marital status, number of childern and home city.

The basic cost for the service is \$30, if the exact year of emigration is known. CHEROKEE RESEARCH RECORDS

CHEROKEE EMIGRATION ROLLS 1817-1835 (HENDERSON ROLL?): Contains the names of over 1600 heads of families of Cherokees who signed up to emigrate to the West under the treaties of 1817 and 1828. It also shows the number in the family, number of slaves, and place of residence in the East before emigration. THESE CHEROKEES LATER BECAME KNOWN AS "THE OLD SETTLER CHEROKEES."

At one time, it was published by the Baker Publishing Co., PO Bx 20951, Okla. City, OK 73120.

CENSUS OF CHEROKEES RESIDING IN ALABAMA, GEORGIA, NORTH CAROLINA, AND TENNESSEE. This census was made before the general removal in 1838-1839 to the West. It contains the names of the heads of families, numbers in the family, place of residence, and other information, such as number of readers of Cherokee and/or English, farmers, weavers, spinners, etc.

White men were the census takers. It is not known whether they had an interpreter present. It appears they wrote down what they thought they heard, consequently, some names were erroneously written. (For instance, the census includes letter sounds that were not used in the Cherokee language, and doesn't show some that were used.) 62 years afterwards, in 1897, a government office prepared a typewritten record from the original document. (There is a possibility this was the 3rd copy, as the original may have been immediately recopied.)

A book, "Those Who Cried", was arranged and indexed by James W. Tyner (and published by Chi-ga-u Inc. 1974). It was taken from the 1897 copy. It contains the names of the heads of families, number in the family, etc. (see above).

DRENNEW ROLL & INDEX OF "EMIGRANT CHEROKEES." This census was actually made in 1851, but has been called the 1852 roll because payment was made in 1852. It covers the Eastern Cherokees who came West after 1835 (Trail of Tears), and who were residing in Indian Territory (now Oklahoma) in 1851. It is arranged by the Districts of the Cherokee Nation. (NOTE: Some districts were later changed, such as: Skin Bayou became Sequoyah.) The families are listed by names in numbered groups. In some cases, the Eastern Cherokee Claim numbers (from the later Guion Miller Index) are listed in parenthesis beside the name(s).

This census has been published in a soft-cover book by Indian Nations Press (Mrs. Charlene Hook), 812 Mayo Building, Tulsa, OK 74103.

- CENSUS TAKEN BY THE CHEROKEE NATION in March 1880, to make a per capita payment of \$16.55 "for purchase of bread stuffs." The money from this payment was called "bread money" by the Cherokees. This roll was arranged by Cherokee Districts and thereunder by the following six schedules: (1) Cherokee citizens including Native, Adopted White, Shawnee, Delaware, and Freedmen, (2) Orphan's Roll under age 16, (3) Rejected Roll, (4) Individuals whose claims to citizenship were pending, (5) Intruders, and (6) Individuals living in the Cherokee Nation by permit. These schedules give the individual's name by family group and his roll number, race, occupation, age, and sex.

A printed copy of the 1880 Census was made for Schedules 1 and 2. This roll was arranged by Cherokee District and thereunder roughly alphabetically. It gives the name, roll number, race, age, and sex for each person. In addition to Schedules 1 and 2, this printed roll contains a schedule of North Carolina Cherokees who had removed to the Cherokee Nation West in the year 1881 under an act of the Cherokee National Council dated 12/3/1880.

When the bread money was actually paid, a per capita receipt roll was prepared by D. W. Lipe (LIPE ROLL), showing name of payee, number in family, total amount paid to family, name of person receiving payment, and name of witness to payment.

The microfilm of the Census and Index are located in the Pt. Worth Federal Archives, with the exception of Schedules 1 and 3 for the Cooweescoowee District, which are missing. The film

record Control Number is 7RA-07, Roll No. 1-4.

The Phillip's Collection of the University of Oklahoma has copies of Schedule 1 for most of the Districts.

Copies of the printed roll may be found in the Ft. Worth Federal Archives, Phillip's Collection of the University of Oklahoma, both the Library and Indian Archives of the Oklahoma Historical Society, Gilcrease Museum Library, and the Cherokee Museum and Archives.

The Lipe Receipt Roll is located in the Ft. Worth Federal Archives, 7RA-33, Roll No. 1-2.

A reprint of what appears to be the original printed Schedule 1 has been made by Chi-ga-u Inc., PO Bx 2241, Norman, OK 73069. (It does not have occupation, which was omitted on the original printed material, and does not have the Orphan's Roll.) This may now be out of print.

NOTE: This census was used by the Dawes Cormission in the preparation of the "Final Rolls" of 1902. No Indian or intermagnied white who was listed on this census was challenged by the Dawes Commission or the courts for enrollment on the Final Rolls. If a person was on the 1880 Census, a notation was made on his 1902 Census Cand showing his location and the name by which he was enrolled on the 1880 Census.

1883

On 5/19/1883, the Cherokee National Council authorized a CENSUS to be taken on which to base per capita payments from money received as a result of leasing their Cherokee Cutlet lands to the Cherokee Strip Livestock Association to use as grazing land for their cattle. This census is arranged by Cherokee Districts, an Orphan's Roll, National Prison List, and a Supplemental Roll of Citizens. It shows only the name and age for each individual.

The first payment of \$50 in silver was paid to the tribal treasury at Tahlequah on 10/1/1883. Lease was for five years at \$100,000 per year. A per capita payment of \$15.50 of the lease money was made in 1883 and was known as "Grass Money" to the Cherokees. The Receipt Roll for this payment shows the individual's name, roll number, total number in the household, total amount paid each household, name of person receiving the payment, and the name of the witness.

The Ft. Worth Federal Archives has (1) 1883 Census, 7RA-29, Roll No. 1; (2) 1883 Census (1897 copy with Sequoyah District missing) 7RA-56, Roll No. 1-2; and (3) Payment Roll 7RA-57, Roll No. 1-3.

1886

CENSUS: In 1886, another per capita payment was made of "Grass Money" of \$15.95. On 7/28/1897, the Cherokee National Council authorized a census roll to be made from the 1886 per capita receipt roll. This roll is arranged by Cherokee District and thereunder by household. It gives the name, age, total number in the household, and the relationship of each individual to the head of the household. This is the first Cherokee roll that gives the relationship to the head of the household. For this reason, it is quite valuable for Cherokee genealogical research.

It is available in the Ft. Worth Federal Archives: 7RA-58, Roll No. 1-2.

CENSUS (no index), Schedules 1-6, (I don't have any information 1890 on this census.) There is also a payment roll. It is available in the Ft. Worth Federal Archives: RA-09,

Roll No. 1-6. The Payment Roll is 7RA-59, Foll No. 1-2. There is another 1890 Payment Roll (1897 copy) which is 7RA-60, Roll No. 1-3.

CENSUS (includes Delawares, Shawnees, and Freedmen). (I don't have 1893 information on this census.)

It is available in the Ft. Worth Federal Archives: 724-54, Roll Ho. 1-2.

PAYMENT ROLL AND INDEX (STARR ROLL). (I don't have information 1994 on this roll.)

OLD SETTLERS PAYMENT ROLL AND CERSUS: (I have secured information 1896 from this roll. It is arranged by District and shows: roll 107.3 number, name, age, sex, degree of Indian blood, and place of 4.6 birtha) It has an Index. for the payment roll.

It is available in the Pt. Worth Federal Archives: (1) Index to Payment Roll T-985, Roll No. 1; (2) Old Settlers Payment Roll 7RA-34, Roll No. 1; and (3) 1896 Census 7RA-19, Roll No. 1. (Index to the Census (not incl. Freedmen): 7RA-71, Roll No. 1.

CENSUS..."DAMES ROLL." Census cards were made up in the late 1900 1800's and early 1900's. A card was made for each head of a family and contains: Roll number, name of family member(s), relationship, age, sex, blood, tribal enrollment (year-districtnumber), tribal enrollment of parents (names, year, and district), and data on prior rolls. Birth affidavits were required for "new borns," Each Census Card is numbered and show District residence, Post Office, Indian tribe. The Dawes Commission rolls were closed in the spring of 1906.

In order to find a "Dawes Roll", you need to know the name of an ancestor who was alive in 1906. Of course, the more information you have, the easier it will be to locate a record. This is a good starting point for genealogical research as it will give parents' names and information about prior rolls.

The 1907 Final Rolls Index is available in the Ft. Worth Federal Archives: M-1186, Roll No. 1.

At one time the Census and Index were printed in hard-cover books. These are available at the Cherokee Tribal Complex and at the Five Civilized Tribes Museum, Muskogee, Okla. 74401.

Census cards may be available at the BIA in Tahlequah or the Cherokee Tribal Complex.

the 1907 Index to Rejected Applications is available in Ft. Worth Federal Archives: 7RA-24, Roll No. 1.

INDEX TO THE GUION MILLER ROLL (of Eastern Cherokee Applications 1909 to the U.S. Court of Claims). These applications were made by members of the Treaty and Removal Parties (Trail of Tears people) or their descendants, (i.e., persons living in Indian Territory and on the Drennen Roll census taken 1851.) The listing was completed in 1909 by Guion Miller; however, it contains names of

individuals with their ages as of 1906.

This is an extremely helpful piece of information, as it contains (if the applicant knew it!) the names of parents, grandparents, great grandparents, brothers and sisters, aunts and uncles. If also gives dates and places.

To obtain a photocopy of an "Application", send \$5 to the Cashier, National Archives (GSA), Washington D C 20408, Attention WNIR. You will need to know the name of your parent or grandparent as they were known in 1906 (1907), when they made the application. The \$5 fee will provide for a maximum of 9 copies from an application file(s). Any file(s) requested which total over 9 pages will be billed at a rate of \$0.50 per page. Check or money order should be made payable to the Mational Archives Trust Fund (NNIR), and addressed to the Cashier, as above.

The 1909 Index to the Guion Miller Roll is available in the Pt. Worth Federal Archives: M-685, Roll No. 1.

BOOKS:

1. Example Starr's "History of the Cherokee Indians and their Legends and Folk Lore". It contains over 300 pages of the genealogy of 39 prominent Cherokee families. He began his work on this book in 1894, and the largest amount of his research on the families was done before 1902, altho it wasn't published until 1921.

The original copy is out of print. A reprint can be obtained from Kraus Reprint Co., Route 100, Millwood, New York 19546 for \$54.50 (price 12/1983).

There are some errors in the book, but, these are generally omissions of family members (rather than giving the wrong information) and typographical errors. (He was rushed in the final proof reading.)

An index to Starr's book was prepared by the late J. J. Hill of Norman, OK, for the genealogical section. It was printed under the title "Old Cherokee Families." It may still be available from J. J. Hill Publishers, Inc., PO Bx 2310, Norman, OK 73070. (It is not mandatory—book can be used without it.)

2. "Our People and Where They Rest", by James W. Tyner and Alice Tyner Timmons. This records information from graves in cemeteries located in the Old Cherokee Nation area of northeastern Oklahoma. So far, there are 11 volumes, It (the set) can be obtained from the Five Civilized Tribes Museum, Muskogee, Okla.

MILITARY RECORDS IN NATIONAL ARCHIVES: National Archives has records of the Cherokee allies in the Creek War of 1813-14. It is filed under "War of 1812". It must be requested on National Archives Trust Pund form NATF Form 80 (1-84). Do not send money with the request. N.A. will notify you if the record is found and you will then need to remit \$5 for a copy. They will research only one record per form. 
