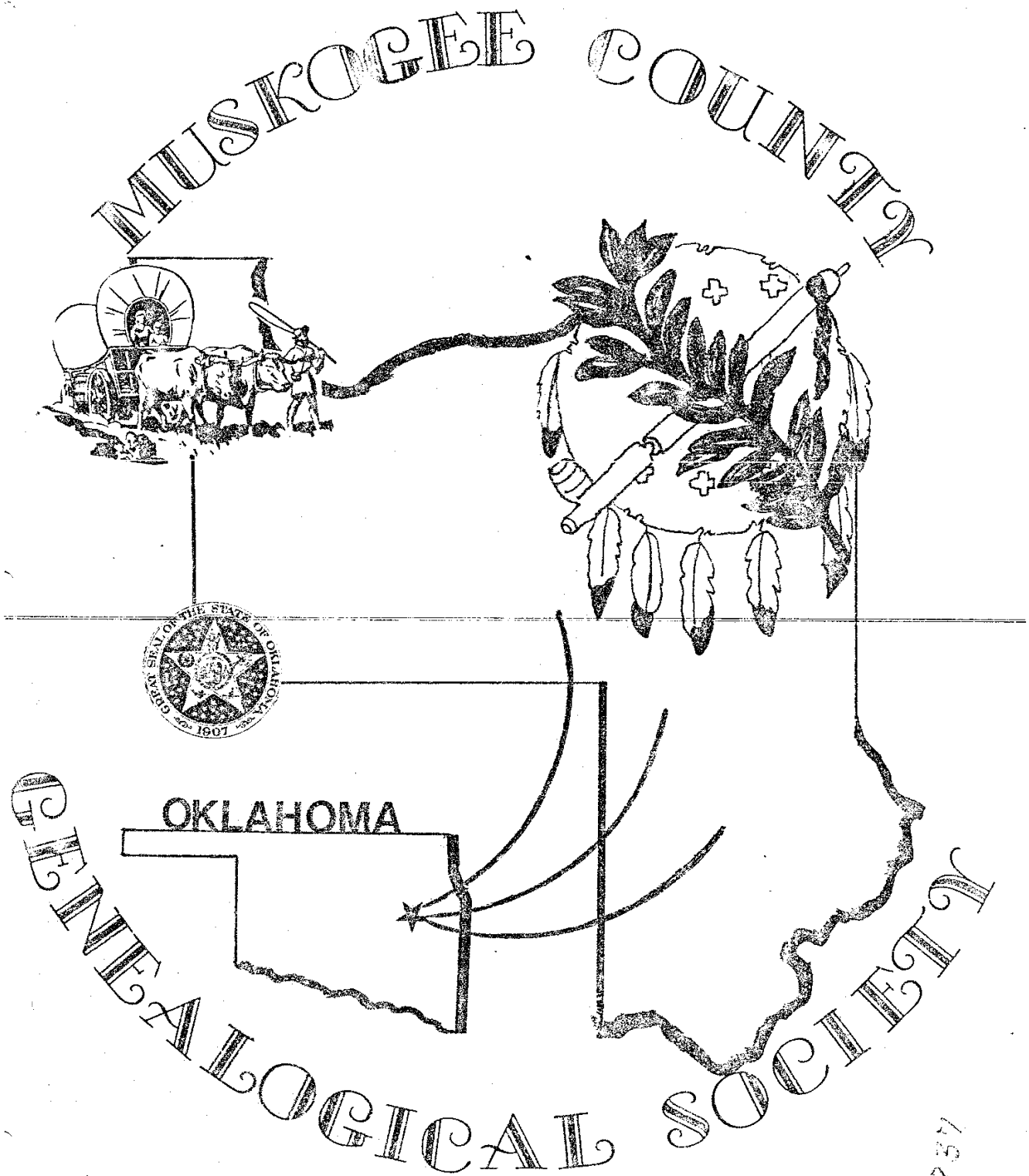

Imprints are newspapers printed during a specific time and/or place. Most of these are obsolete, or have been bought out by other newspapers. Some may be available and on record at the Newspaper Archives, Oklahoma Historical Society, Historical Building, Oklahoma City, OK, 73105. If you make a request PLEASE be specific (name, place or event & date). Handling charges are \$1.50 plus 10¢ per page or 25¢ for microfilm copy.

An interesting note to genealogists is the description given to location. Often a key to where locals would consider business dealings.

"The number of newspapers and periodicals published in Indian Territory is 232, including 17 daily, 3 semi-weekly, 210 weekly and 2 monthly."

OKLAHOMA HOMESTEAD RECORDS IN THE NATIONAL ARCHIVES

Most of the settlers of Oklahoma Territory, as well as many of the pioneers of twenty-nine other states, obtained their titles to the land through homestead claims. These claims with the necessary documentation are filed in the land-entry records of the National Archives. If the homestead applicant followed the proscribed procedures, the papers will contain information of genealogical value: age and birthplace of the claimant, date on which residence was established, marital status, and number of members in the family. Other information in the file is worthwhile for reconstructing the life of the homesteader: improvements on the land, type of land, and uses of the land.

The procedure for requesting the homestead file in the National Archives requires more than the name of the claimant to initiate the search. The information which you must furnish depends upon the date on which the homestead claim became final. This date is usually five years after the initial settlement began.

I. Final claims filed prior to 1908:

State the full name of the homesteader and one of the following:

(1) Legal description of the land by Section, Township and Range; county and state.

OR (2) Date, or approximate date of the entry, and the name of the land office through which the entry was made, including county and state.

II. Final claims filed after 1908:

State the full name of the homesteader and:

(3) Number assigned to the case at the time that the land was patented. A legal description of the land, as in item (1) is also helpful.

III. Send your request with the required information to:

General Branch, Civil Archives Division
National Archives Records Service
Washington, D.C. 20409

The reply from the N.A.R.S. will have an order form and a request for payment.

There are no homestead records in the National Archives for the non-public domain states: the thirteen original states, Kentucky, Maine, Vermont, West Virginia, Tennessee, Texas, and Hawaii. Within Oklahoma, no homesteads were settled in the counties that were part of the Indian Territory in 1906. The counties which were originally part of Greer County, Texas before being annexed to Oklahoma, have a few homesteads which were established under U.S. Homestead Acts.

Two documents which are available at the county level will give the information needed for requesting a homestead file. The Final Receipt of Homestead Claim gives the information needed for requesting files on final claims filed prior to 1908. The Patent Record has the information necessary for locating the papers on final claims filed after 1908. Both documents are in the appropriate record book, fully indexed by name of the homesteader, at the

county courthouse in the county in which the claim was located. In the case of county reorganization, the record will be in the county in which the claim was originally filed at the time of the initial settlement.

Local abstract offices in the county also have the patent record, as well as complete documentation of the changes of ownership of the land. The abstract files are indexed by the legal description of the land, however, and not by the name of the homesteader. The County Clerk's office can give you the names of all abstract offices.

State historical societies and those of the local county are also sources for the names of homesteaders and a legal description of the homestead land. The societies often have indexes to this information. Give them a name or surname, approximate year of the initial settlement, and the name of the county. A contact with these societies or a genealogical society may furnish you with the information you need to request a homestead record from the National Archives.

Often you must first study the history of the settlement of the state and of the specific counties before you can begin to contact state and county offices and societies. If you use a study of the settlement along with the entry of your ancestor in census records, then you can decide upon an approximate year for the initial homestead claim, the name of the county, and the name of the land office which received the claim.

When you receive a homestead file from the National Archives, you will have a glimpse into the past. A homestead file ranks with pension files and old letters in providing more than names and dates for the family history. These items help us to understand the life and struggles of an ancestor.

35 MILLION NAMES
TO BE INDEXED.

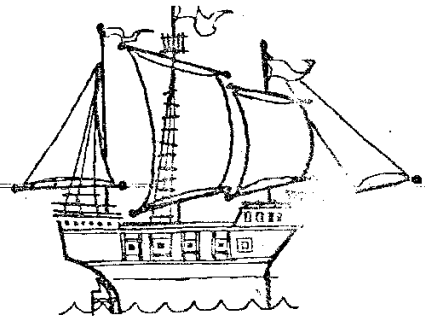

When researchers complete the mammoth project of indexing names of 35 million immigrants who came to America by ship between 1820 and 1924, a whole new world will be opened to genealogists.

Temple University-Balch Institute Center for Immigration Research is in the process of indexing on computer the ancestors of about 100 million Americans living today.

Researchers in the project, under the direction of Temple's Dr. Ira Glazier, Professor of economic history are laboriously extracting names from hundreds of ships' manifests and indexing those names into alphabetical order. The index will also be listed according to the country from which these people emigrated. A news release by Temple University indicated this research will represent the missing link between European village records and U.S. Census information.

Information being indexed includes names of ships, passengers, and their towns or villages of origin, their destinations, those who accompanied them, the dates of arrival, their occupation and related data. The White House has called the collection the "Fort Knox of American History", Dr. Glazier said in the news release. Glazier has already completed



a multi-volume work, "The Famine Immigrants: Lists of Irish Immigrants Arriving at the Port of New York, 1846-1851."

This is the only work so far available to the public, the center is not in a position to respond to inquiries because it is still extracting names.

Glazier based his work and the much larger computer index on original ships' manifests that he found in a Maryland warehouse. The manifests had been microfilmed by the federal Government in the 1940s and 1950s.

He acquired the manifests only after promising the National Archives a computerized index in return, according to the news release.

His eventual goal is to go through all the manifests along the Atlantic and gulf ports.
