We always find ourselves reminding people doing research in Eastern Oklahoma that prior to 1907, this was <u>Indian Territory</u> and was divided by tribal nations, therefore, our material in the Quarterly may extend into the Cherokee and Choctaw Nations, as well as, our own nation of the Creeks. In fact, Muskogee County is in both the Cherokee and Creek Nations. Doing research here, prior to statehood is entirely different than in the eastern states.

We have a new pamphlet entitled "TIPS FOR BEGINNERS TRACING CHEROKEE ANCESTORS", which should be of great help to those starting out doing Indian research. It costs \$1.50 which includes postage. Please include a S.A.S.E. with your request. We want to thank Virginia Perry, Maxine Harris and Mickey Hagan for all the work they did in putting this pamphlet together.

North Fork Town, or Micco, was once a well known Creek settlement in the Creek Nation of Indian Territory. Many of the prominent families of I.T. made it their home prior to the Civil War. It was also the location of the Asbury Mission School. The town laid at the crossroads for the Texas emmigrants and cattle drives on the Texas Road, and California-bound gold seekers on the Ft. Smith Road, establishing it's merchants as well-stocked and prosperous traders.

One of these busy traders was "Old Billy" Nero, a highly respected Negro, who not only engaged in the trading post business, but also had a stage stand, a blacksmith shop, a ferriaging service and a mill. Nero had a good log home consisting of five or six large rooms to accommodate his wife and eight (or ten) children. In Nero's 1871 ledger it states, "List of Family Names: Nancy Nero, Joseph, Governor and Cornelia Flack", but by then most of his family was grown.

Wm. Nero's father was probably, Governor Nero, who was mentioned by Chilly McIntosh, saying, "He died about 1854, and had bought the "first set" and the "second set" of his children [from slavery], he had "needed help to finish paying for one" child and had borrowed \$300. from an "old woman" and given her


his note. He had owned a wagon, 3 or 4 head of oxen, and 10 ponies, which his children inherited after his death. He was not a freedman, but a free negro; which were numerous in Creek country.

A post office was established August of 1853 under the name of Micco, meaning "chief" in Creek language, with trader, Catlett J. Atkins, as postmaster. This was closed in 1873 when the M.K.&T. Railroad came to Eufaula, a few miles west of of North Fork Town. Many of the stores closed down as well. Today the fields of old North Fork town is under water due to the Arkansas Dam.

The Wm. Nero Family Cemetery was located near his store, showing where William Nero died 12 Sep 1872, at age 46; and wife, Nancy, dying 2 Mar 1907, 85 yrs. old. All tombstones were moved 1962 to Fishertown Cemetery, McIntosh County.

The following list of names are from William Nero's 1866-70 Trading Post Ledger, which shows many of the well-known people of that area and Muskogee County. This ledger is most important to the Creek Nation's history as it paints a picture of reconstruction following the Civil War. The Creek Nation scattered during the war, some going to Texas and the Confederacy; while others went to Kansas and the Union. It was a terrible blow to the Creek Nation and it's families.

Some explaination about the ledger: It was among the papers belonging to Thomas F. Meagher, a Muskogee and Tulsa citizen, who was active with the W.P.A. projects collecting pioneer history. The letter "M" along side a name refers to his notes on the ledger. I have added a few notes on some of the names, such as their purchase, in order to clarify. Most of the purchases were such things as: tobacco, flour, salt, sugar, coffee, clothes and shoes, and even an occasional "bought" cake for someone's birthday.

#### CREEK INDIAN NAMES

In 1939, John R. Swanton, of the Smithonian Institute, interviewed Legus F. PERRYMAN and Pleasant PORTER, both ex-chiefs of the Creek Nation, on the customs and traditions of the Creek people. The following information on Creek names comes from that interview and Angie Debo's, "Road to Disappearance, A History of the Creek Indian."

Chiefs were called Micco or "town king" and was known as "Coweta Micco" or "Tuckabatchee Micco", etc, naming them after their town.

War officials were grouped to rank: Little emarthlas, Big emarthlas and Tustenuggees.

The Clans ruled: The Wind Clan, the most important, however, Bear, Bird, Raccoon, Alligator, Deer, were also important.

The young man was not allowed to take part of the rites of the men until they had participated in a raid. A war title was then conferred and the casual clan or family name was dropped. The usual title consisted of two parts: first, the name of his clan, his town; then came his official designation, such as Micco, Tustennuggee, Emarthla or Heneha, or the arbitrary distinction HARJO ("recklessly brave", usually translated as "mad" or "crazy"), FIXICO ("heartless", literally "without feelings"), or YAHOLA (from the mystical cry given in the black drink ceremony).

Girl children were given conventionalized names that had originally had some such meaning as "getting-very-near-the-enemy-by-stratagem" or "two-returning-wounded".

Secretaries and court clerks often produced variations of Creek names in their attempt to conform to "civilized" customs, thus Tulwa Fixico became T.W. Fixico; Hotul-ke Emarthla was changed to Hotulk E. Marthla.

Women began using names such as Jane, Peggy, Betty, etc, and with surnames, Mrs. Tiger, or Mrs. Fixico.

Note Creek Indian Researchers: there was a Creek community in the Illinois
District of the Cherokee Nation, called Greenleaf town, near what we call
Braggs today in Muskogee County. These Creeks were adopted as Cherokees.



# MARRIAGES IN THE CHOCTAW NATION AND INDIAN TERRITORY

The following is a list of marriages performed by the Rev. R.J. Hogue, who was a Baptist Missionary to the Choctaw Indians. He went to Indian Territory in 1858 and lived there until his death in 1906. He first lived near the old Armstrong Academy, near the present town of Bokchito, Okla. In 1871 he moved to Boggy Depot, which was about 10 miles from the present town of Atoka, and lived there until he moved to Atoka in the 1890s. There seems to be no records of the marriages which he performed in the early part of his ministery, or if there were any kept we do not find them. These marriage records and the church membership records were found in Rev. Hogue's diaries and the original church register.
