★ I.T. FRATERNAL ORDERS

Many of our male ancestors belonged to fraternal orders, such as the Masons, Odd Fellows, Woodmen of the World, Knights of Pythias and the Grange. It was no different in Indian Territory.

The first Free Mason Lodge established in Indian Territory was began by the Cherokees in Tahlequah. The charter was issued from the Grand Lodge in Fort Smith, Arkansas, and called Cherokee Lodge No. 21 on Nov. 9, 1848. Both Indians and white men, who came into the territory as soldiers, merchants, teachers and missionaries, were participants. Officers and brethren of the Cherokee lodge for 1850 were:

The second Lodge was begun at Ft. Gibson, Nov. 5, 1850. Many of the members were army men stationed at the Fort.

The Creeks did not affiliate with the established lodges, although most of their leaders were Freemasons. Geo. W. STIDHAM and Ben MARSHALL, Creek leaders, were active in getting the charter for Muskogee Lodge #93 on Nov. 9, 1855, to be located at "the town of Creek Agency, State of Ark. and within three miles." Creek Agency being north of the present site of the city of Muskogee. Some early members were: Wm. WHITEFIELD, John BARNWELL, Goliath HAROD, Sam'l CHECOTE and Casuthe YARHOLA. The charter was evoked in 1867, to be reinstated after Muskogee became a town.

In 1894 the Muskogee Chapter moved to the "magnificient rooms in the Turner Building", but unfortunately, the February 1899 fire destroyed records, other valuables and paintings illustrating Indian life.

From the 1880, 1883 and 1885 Indian Territory Grand Lodge Reports we find these memorials to their dead members:

Knights of Pythias

The Knights of Pythias was established at the close of the Civil War to reunite order between the North and South, and to heal the broken ties of fraternal love.

From the Official Journal of Proceedings, held at Shawnee, Oklahoma, April 30, 1907, we learn these memorials to their dead: (Muskogee was Phoenix #3, Webbers Falls -Stand Watie, and Ft. Gibson - George B. Shaw)



Battle of Honey Springs July 17, 1863

Eli GRAYSON, a Creek boy at the time of the battle, later "told of watching from Chimney Mt. and seeing the smoke from cannons." The Confederates were camped near what later became known as "Pumkin Ridge."

Approximately 209 men were believed killed or wounded - 134 Confederates and 75 Union soldiers.

The bodies of the dead were buried pretty much where they fell. Some years later many, if not all, of them were removed to Ft. Gibson National Cemetery. The government moved only Union soldiers.

Hardy COLBERT, a local Choctaw freedman, was given the job of identifying the soldiers remains by their Union buttons, but guessed some Rebel bones were mixed with the Yankees in his wagon.

I.T. 1900 CENSUS TRIVIA

HERMAN JOHNSON VANN

By Virginia Vann Perry

According to a Guion Miller application signed by him on November 24, 1906, Herman Johnson Vann was born September 8, 1852 in Delaware District, Cherokee Nation. His Indian name was Wa-la-loo. His father was William Vann, son of Rich Joe Vann, and his mother was Sabra Elizabeth Thompson, daughter of James Allen Thompson. History and family tradition relate his father was murdered in 1852. Not much is known of Herman's growing years, but he was living in Webbers Falls, Oklahoma with Vann relatives at an early age. He apparently received a good education because among his books was one "University Algebra" with the flyleaf noted: "H.J. Vann commenced this book Feb. the 8th, 1870, Cane Hill College". This college was just across the border in Arkansas. A family bible records he married Elizabeth Davis, daughter of Earl E. and Amanda Davis on January 25, 1876 at Briartown, I.T.

H.J. Vann is listed on page 52 of Canadian District 1880 Cherokee Census at the age of 27 as having 175 cattle, 75 hogs, 3 mules and 8 horses. In addition to being a full time owner/operator of a growing ranch business, he taught school in the Briartown-Porum area, later operated a general store and served as postmaster at Briartown. He served as Clerk of Canadian Dist., Cherokee Nation, in 1875, 1877, 1879, 1881, 1887; and Judge of the same district in 1891, 1893 and 1897. He was a very busy man...accepting public service whenever needed.

H. J. Vann died August 23, 1912, leaving a wife and eight children. One daughter, Daisy Vann Stacy is still living at Porum. Three granddaughters of H.J. Vann still live in the area: June Stacy Maxfield, of Porum; Jean Vann and Virginia Vann Perry of Muskogee.
