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## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

It is Christmastime. The busy time of the year is upon us and our society is participating in a very important event.

With the help of the Utah Genealogical Society, we will be microfilming records from Muskogee County. Members have been busy canvassing the county and taking inventories of material of genealogical nature. Permission to microfilm must be secured from the record custodian. It is quite a time consuming job, but we will be making a huge contribution to researchers when this film is made available through the Utah Genealogical Society's main library in Salt Lake City, Utah and through branch libraries throughout the world.

The Muskogee Public Library will be closed from January 15 through January 15 of 1991. As the library is going computer, the staff will be busy at this time barcoding the book collection. With this system, a library staff member will be able to determine immediately if a book is checked out, when it is due back, who is on the waiting list, and what books a patron has checked out. Overdue notices can be sent out within eight days of the item becoming overdue. This system should make a more efficient use of library materials.

SO--REMEMBER - DON'T PLAN TO DO YOUR GENEALOGICAL RESEARCH BETWEEN JANUARY 15 THROUGH JANUARY 25. We hope our out of town genealogists don't choose this time to do their Muskogee County searching.

We had a great group come out for the November meeting when ex-Marshall, Larry Beard spoke. He told us about the duties of a Marshal which included the taking of the census in the early days.

Your genealogical society sponsored the October Book Sale this year. Virginia Perry inherited the job of coordinating this project every year. Society members worked with her sorting books into categories and placing them on tables. When the doors opened on the days of the sale, the books, magazines, records and pictures were neat and in order. Those helping were Jim Voss, Shirley Griffith, Vonda Painter, Mickey Hagan, Debra Shamblin and Geneva Taylor. This was the best sale yet, and the library appreciated the efforts of the society.

For our seven years, we also are appreciative of the library making available rooms for us, both for our general and board meetings.

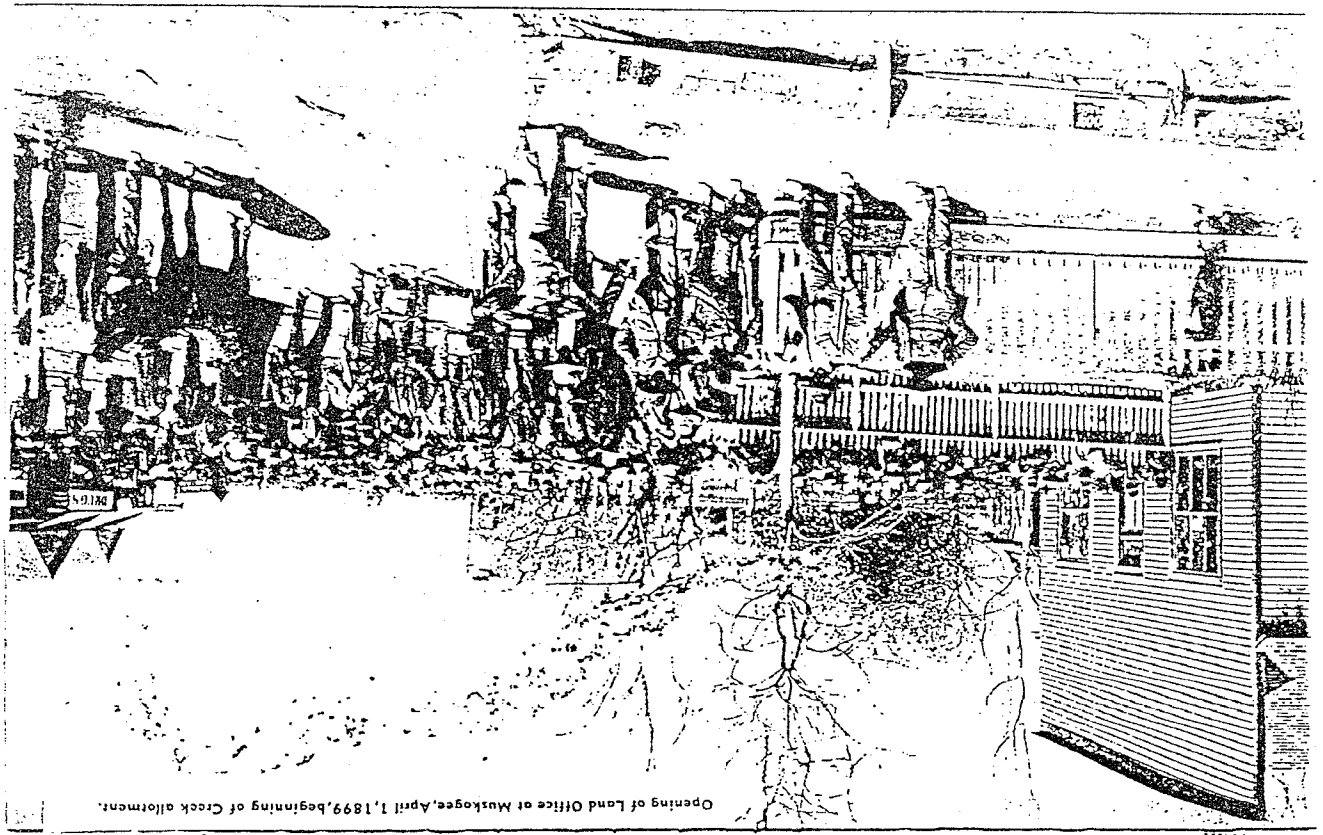
Interested in information of an ancestor, Jefferson Patley, Starr's  
 history of the Cherokee Indians" show the name as Jefferson Rattiff.  
 The story is after the Civil War, no one knew how to spell the last name.  
 The name Patley was found inscribed on the back of a picture. Jefferson  
 Patley was my grandmother's (maternal side) father, who was killed during  
 the Civil War.

From information gathered, the home was on the land where Fansteel is now  
 located west side of the Arkansas River between Fort Gibson and Muskogee,  
 north of U. S. Highway #62. Since Muskogee Turnpike was built, the land  
 would be between the Turnpike and Arkansas River. According to an allotment  
 map of Cherokee Nation, Lawrence Ratley, a grandson allotted the above land  
 from Cherokee tribe.

From Starr's "History of the Cherokee Indians" the family line is Cordery.  
 My grandmother's name was Eliza Jane Ratley Martin Sims (two marriages).  
 I have heard my grandmother speak of Aunt Susie Foreman - who is listed  
 in the Cordery line.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILING DELAYED CERTIFICATE OF BIRTH

The attached Delayed Certificate of Birth may be filed if three records proving the facts of this person's birth can be sent to the Division of Vital Statistics of the State Department of Health to be examined and entered on the certificate form. *Records made less than 5 years before the date of application for filing the Delayed Certificate are not acceptable as proof.* **THREE ACCEPTABLE RECORDS ARE REQUIRED.**

**FACTS TO BE PROVED BY RECORDS SENT THIS OFFICE:**

1. Date of birth
2. Place of birth
3. Parent's names

**TYPES OF RECORDS WHICH MAY BE SENT IF THEY SHOW THE FACTS TO BE PROVED**

(All records except affidavits will be returned with the certified copy of the completed certificate.)

1. Physician's office record of birth. (Send copy of this signed by the physician.)
2. Hospital record of birth. (Send a statement of the facts in the hospital record signed by the custodian of the hospital records.)
3. Life insurance policy or burial insurance policy. (Send policy if taken out 5 years or more ago and shows age or date of birth, and birthplace.)
4. School enrollment record. (Write the principal of any school attended by this person 5 years or more ago and ask for copy of school record of this person's date of birth, place of birth, and parents' names.)
5. School census enumeration record. (Write the County Superintendent of Schools of the county in which the person went to school 5 years or more ago and ask for copy of enumeration record.)
6. Army, Navy, or Marine discharge record. (Send record if date of enlistment was 5 years or more ago.)
7. Social Security Account Application. (If application was made 5 years or more ago, write Social Security Administration, Candler Building, Baltimore, Maryland, for photostat copy.)
8. U. S. Census enumeration record or state census enumeration record. (Application blanks for U. S. Census enumeration records may be obtained from the Vital Statistics office. Only a few of the states have ever taken a census of their own.)
9. Certified birth certificate of a child of this person. (If child was born 5 years or more ago, send full certificate showing ages and birthplaces of parents. Notification copies usually do not show complete information on parents.)
10. Marriage license application record. (Secure from license clerk if marriage took place 5 years or more ago and if application showed correct age, date of birth, and place of birth.)
11. Voting registration record. (Send record if made 5 years or more ago and shows age, and place of birth.)
12. Affidavit of personal knowledge and memory. (Must be made by parent, older relative, or other older person having personal knowledge of the birth. **ONLY ONE SUCH AFFIDAVIT MAY BE USED.**)
13. Many other types of records (baptismal certificates, employment records, etc.) may be used if they were made 5 years or more ago and show birthdate or age, birthplace, and parents' names.

**STEPS TO TAKE:**

1. Fill out top half only of certificate with correct information about this person whose birth is to be registered on the Delayed Certificate of Birth.
2. This person, himself, must sign Item 10 before a Notary Public. (A parent may sign a young child's name for him.)
3. Send three separate records of proof to this office with the signed Delayed Certificate.
4. Be sure to put enough postage on the envelope and to put your return address on the envelope.
5. Enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope for your certified copy and documents to be returned in.

**REMEMBER:** The certificate cannot be accepted until the required records of proof have been sent as outlined above.
