Benge, among the first to head any of three major divisions of the Indian service, created in a reorganization following recommendations of the Hoover Commission, will head the health, education, welfare, employment and tribal relations branches of the Indian Service in the United States.

An employe of the Indian Service for some time Benge has been superintendent of an Indian agency in New York state, it was learned here.

SAM HOUSTON 'JAB' BENGE PAWHUSKA (Special) — Funeral services for Sam Houston "Jab" Benge, 62, will be held at 2:30 p.m. Saturday at the Johnson Funeral Home Chapel here with Reverend Finley Reid, pastor of the First Methodist Church, officiating.

Burial services will be held at 2:30 p.m. Sunday at the Citizens Cemetery at Fort Gibson.

Benge died Tuesday following a heart attack at the Drummond-Strohm ranch of which he was foreman. He was a member of a Cherokee family which has lived in the Fort Gibson area for more than 100 years. He was a rancher at Fort Gibson before moving to Pawhuska in 1931. He was the son of the late Sam H. and Sallie Benge of Fort Gibson where he was born February 26, 1898. BOYNTON, OKLAHOMA

In Volume 6, Number 2 of the Muskogee County Genealogical Society Quarterly, a synopsis of the city of Boynton in the year 1910 was given. This article was from the newspaper, "The Boynton Index." The "Index", founded in 1910 told of the progress made in the next 15 years, the article being written April 24, 1925.

The following extracts are taken from this newspaper as extracted by Lillie Hodge Wiedel.

April 15, 1921

J.R. BARROTT, of Franklin, Pennsylvania, is the new superintendent of the Transcontinental refinery in this city. He succeeds A.W. McALLISTER.

The Boynton Horse Company, composed of W.W. KELLEY, Leo MILLER, Lee PERKINS, C.E. SIEGENTHALER, C.B. MURPHY and T.T. TIREY, bought a thoroughbred Belgian stallion from J.M. NOLAN, of Paola, Kansas, Monday. He will make the season at Mr. KELLEY'S farm 5½ miles west of Boynton and a mile and a half north of Eram.

April 22, 1921

Organization of a Chamber of Commerce at the Boynton Hotel Wednesday, where representatives of the business interest participated as follows: Lester RAINS, Dr. Emmett DILL, E.G. YORK, W.F. THOMPSON, S.B. REDMOND, Frank OBER, J.R. BARROTT, Geo. M. WISDOM, A.E. WOODWARD, W.F. GOOD, Henry WHITE, Wm. KIESEL, J.E. ALLRED, I.D. ALLRED, Rev. J.R. HEDGES, J.L. ANTHONY, C.L. RAY, W.A. WOODWARD, J.W. ARMSTRONG, S.G. MILLER, H.R. WHALEY, O.F. THORNTON, J.A. BLACKWOOD, Paul PATTERSON, Sam KHOURIE, Ben HADAD, B.L. LEWIS, H.H. PARKHURST and Isaiah KIRBEY.

Professor C.E. WIGGINS of Britton, has been employed as superintendent of Boynton public schools for the coming year.

Streeter McCOY, for many years employed in the First National Bank of this city and for the last few years with the Muskogee National Bank in Muskogee, has been appointed assistant cashier of the Union National Bank of Okmulgee, the new bank recently organized by W.L. WINELAND and associates.

Dr. GRAVES and Dr. MINOR have leased the southeast corner room of the I.O.O.F. Hall over the HADDAD and KHOURIE store and have fitted up a neat and attractive office.

July 8, 1921

J.W. ARSTRONG sold the Boynton Motor Company to Elza and Sam COBB last Saturday. These boys were born and reared in this vicinity and are well known. Mr. ARMSTRONG will be business manager. The Boynton Motor Company was founded by Mr. ARMSTRONG five years ago.

July 22, 1921

L.A. BARNHILL, formerly owner of the bakery in this city and now proprietor of the Haskell Baking Company, bought the Wm. KIESEL bakery Monday and took charge Tuesday. He has placed Mr. Howard STARR, a baker of 12 years experience, in charge. Mr. KIESEL will buy a farm and engage in the poultry and hog business.

August 26, 1921

ALLRED and MORGAN have sold their barber shop to Walter CASEY, of Haskell who is now in charge. Mr. ALLRED has moved to Okmulgee. Mr. MORGAN and Mr. THURMAN will continue in the employ of Mr. CASEY.

November 4, 1921

Joe TONE of Porum, and George JANSELL of this city, have rented the DOUGHERTY-NICHOLS Building and will put in a stock of general merchandise.

December 2, 1921

J.H. OGLE arrived from Hoyt Wednesday and opened his real estate, loan, insurance, and collection agency in the rear of the Bank of Boynton. His family will arrive next week.

January 13, 1922

A.M. RUSH sold his transfer wagon to D.E. ORMAN last week, who took immediate possession and employed J.E. BILLINS as driver. Mr. ORMAN has been a resident of this section of the state for the past 17 years.

June 9, 1922

Dr. J.B. WOOD, formerly of St. Louis, Missouri, the new physician who came to Boynton two weeks ago to make his home, has been located in Sallisaw for the past year.

November 17, 1922

Rev. C.B. HOLLAND is the new pastor of the Methodist Church here. Rev. N.T. PEAK goes to Quapaw and Carden.

DID YOU KNOW? The first Baptist Church in Oklahoma was started at the Webbers Falls near Three Forks. The Baptist missionary, Isaac McCoy, along with Reverend David Lewis and wife, John Davis, a Creek, and three Negro slaves, Quasch, Bob and Ned. The slaves belong to the Creeks. This gathering took place on September 9, 1832.

Thus, the Muskogee Baptist Church was organized.

Quilt turned into family tree

Eulma Lee Montgomery of Muskogee cherishes a quilt that tells 189 years of family history.

Montgomery had a genealogical quilt made after tracing her lineage to the Rev. Thomas Edom of Tennessee, a great-grandfather she never knew.

The 48-block wagon wheel quilt begins with Edom and continues to present day. Generations of names are written in indelible ink on the pastel pink, yellow and blue wagon wheels. Heads of households are printed in the center on the hubs. Other names are listed on spokes.

Each block on the quilt represents a family.

Montgomery said the quilt has helped her and other family members become acquainted with many people they never met.

"Reading about them and visiting their graves makes you feel like you are meeting them for the first time," she said.

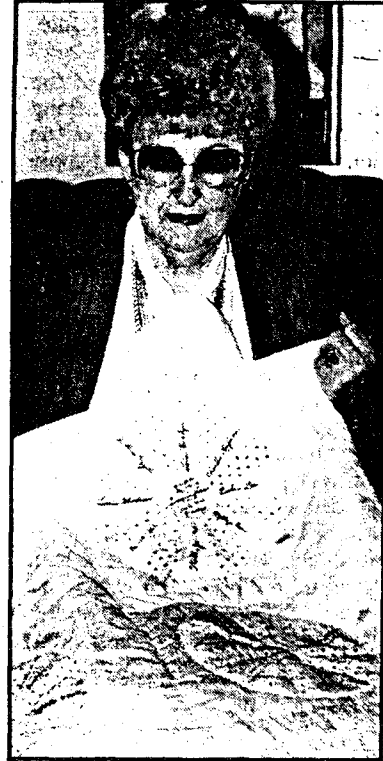
The quilt took three years to make. It was made by women at Fellowship Tabernacle Assembly of God Church in Amarillo, Texas. Names on the quilt were written by Montgomery and other family members.

Montgomery's niece, Margaret Butler of Tulsa, began tracing the family line in 1980. Butler said she picked the brains of every family member, gathering rumors, gossip and all.

Butler and other family members worked for 10 years assembling the information. Records were checked at the Oklahoma and Arkansas historical commissions, census bureaus, newspapers and libraries.

"It was like working with a huge puzzle," Butler said.

When the pieces fell into place, Edom was the American beginning, Butler said. She believes

his forefathers came from England.

Digging up old bones brought quite a few surprises for Montgomery.

She found out one of her grandfathers had a marriage he never revealed.

"When he was 40 he married a girl 18, just two months after his first wife died," Montgomery said. "It only lasted a couple of years before he married his third wife."

Montgomery also discovered relatives in Arkansas and Oregon she never knew existed. These and many other discoveries is why the quilt is so important.

"We almost lost our family in time," Montgomery said.

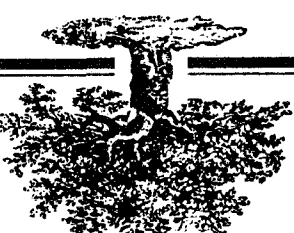
