Supplement to the <u>Vinita Republican</u>, Vinita, Indian Territory Friday, September 8, 1905.

Department of the Interior, Commissioner to the Five Civilized Tribes.

### UNDETERMINED CHEROKEE CITIZENS

Whereas it is provided by Section 25 of the Act of Congress approved July 1, 1902 (32 Stat. L., 716), known as the Cherokee Agreement, that:

"The roll of citizens of the Cherokee Nation shall be made as of September first, Nineteen Hundred and Two, and the names of all persons then living and entitled to enrollment on that date, shall be placed on said roll by the Commissioner to the Five Civilized Tribes" and,

Whereas, application has been made for the enrollment of the persons named below, whose names are found on the 1880 Authenticated Roll or 1896 Census Roll of citizens of the Cherokee Nation, and,

Whereas, no definite information has been presented or is at present obtainable to the effect that the persons named below were living and entitled to enrollment on September 1, 1902.

Now therefore, notice is given that the applications for the enrollment of all persons named below concerning whom no information is received prior to December 1, 1905, will, on that date be dismissed.

### BIOGRAPHY OF FRED AND MIRIAM CLEMENT

FRED AND MIRIAM CLEMENT moved to Haskell in April, 1920 after their marriage at Okmulgee on March 20th. Fred took a job as a mechanic and car salesman for the J. O. Dowdy Motor Company; but, they planned to return to Muskogee where their parents lived. They quickly became part of the community and lived here in Muskogee the remainder of their lives.

Fred Rockwell Clement was born January 21, 1895 in Grayson County, Texas on the homestead established by his grandparents in 1840. His parents were William Manning Clement and Agnes Dixon Kinghorn Clement. Fred's family moved to Muskogee, I.T. in 1904 and built a home at 1623 East Broadway where his mother lived until her death in 1943. Fred attended Saint Joseph's Academy. He was a member of the first Boy Scout Troup in Muskogee. He developed a love for the out-of-doors in his early years and became a hunter and a fisherman. He enjoyed these sports throughout his life. After school, Fred worked for Mr. Will Chandler at his general store. That is where he met Miriam.

MIRIAM MILLIGAN CLEMENT was born at Pryor Creek, I. T. January 22, 1898. She was the daughter of Elmer Vicker Milligan and Ada Launa Mills. In 1898 her family travelled partly by covered wagon, partly be train, to Idaho where they homesteaded. They returned to Oklahoma about 1912 and eventually settled in Muskogee. After attending Muskogee High School, Miriam worked for Mr. Will Chandler and the B. E. Spivey Co., a ladies specialty store.

Fred enlisted in the 4th Mounted Cavalry during World War I and served at Schofield Barracks in Hawaii and later on the Mexican Border Patrol stationed at Fort Ringgold, Texas. After his discharge from the service, he returned to Muskogee and later moved to Haskell after his marriage to Miriam.

While living in Haskell three children were born to the family, and the entire family became involved in community Miriam joined the Robertson Memorial Presbyterian activities. Church which her children later also joined. One of her favorite pasttimes was meeting her friends at Mr. Bill Pinkard's Drug Store in the afternoons, all of them with their babies in buggies, then taking a stroll through the business district to the Post Office, then home to fix supper for the family. These ladies continued their friendship for many years. Miriam was an organizer of the first P. T. A. in Haskell and was instrumental in establishing a hot soup program at the local school during the depression. Ladies would volunteer for the program and prepare hot soup or beans for any student who wanted to eat. There were no charge for the meal; many families weren't financially able to pay for the lunch. at --

On cold winter mornings, our home across the street from the school was open to children who lived in rural areas and came to school early. School buses did not have heaters back then. Many children walked several miles to attend school. Miriam would make hot tea or chocolate to bring to the children warming around the stove. She never forgot the hard times and the way the community worked together to feed hungry children. Our home was always open to our friends and became a gathering place for neighborhood children to share hot gingerbread or cookies after school.

Fred worked for the Haskell Water Department during the depression and helped to build the new water plant in the sand hills of Wagoner County, east of Haskell, which replaced Arkansas River water for Haskell. He also helped build Haskell Lake, originally named Lake Juancita for Governor Bill Murray's son. Fred was proud of the former park-like area surrounding the lake where Haskell families would go in the evenings for a cook out or for sunrise breakfasts on the point of the lake. He helped stock the lake with game fish from the State Hatcheries at Tahlequah. This made Haskell Lake an excellent bass fishing lake for many years.

In 1937, Fred became postmaster of Haskell and transferred to Route One mail carrier in 1944. A job that he was well suited for since he loved helping people. All during World War II, Fred would write "Hi" on the back of letters mailed to servicemen. This was against Postal rules, but the servicemen loved it. He received many letters from them as a result of his warm gesture. He always delivered personally all the packages to Haskell people which arrived too late to be delivered for Christmas day. We never had Christmas breakfast or opened packages until Fred and made his deliveries.

After the war was over, Fred and Miriam held an open house for anyone who wanted to come. The house was crowded with young men and women who had not seen each other for four or five years. These young people had served in distant corners of the world and were happy to be in Haskell again. The party lasted until 6 am the next day when the last soldier left. I remember so well after mother and dad saw the last guest off with a tired wave goodbye, mother turned to dad and burst into tears—tears of joy and thankfulness for the safe return of these young soldiers, including their own two sons.

Fred and Miriam began the annual program at the ce cemetery on Memorial Day and would rise early to place American Legion owned U.S. flags on the graves of all the veterans. The couple was active in area Democratic Party affairs for many years. Fred also was a member of the Haskell Volunteer Fire Department, the Sportman's Club, the American Legion, V.F.W., the Isaac Walton Club, and the Kiwanis Club. His hobby was preparing barbecued chicken for friends and as for money-making projects for Haskell Clubs. He became quite well known for these events. He always had plenty of volunteers to help him turn the chickens. They frequently prepared feasts for as many as 500 people.

Miriam was a charter member of the Haskell Book Club which became the Haskell Study Club. She was also a member of the Haskell Music Club. She enjoyed good music and was an avid reader. Miriam died suddenly in September 1968. Fred, who retired from his beloved Route One, Haskell in 1965, died in September 1969. Both are buried at Haskell.

Their three children were reared in Haskell. Billy Milligan Clement graduated from Haskell High School, attended Oklahoma A and M College until war was declared.

Billy then enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He married Sarah Katherine Ussery of North Carolina and they had two children. Billy retired from the Navy in 1962, and the family now lives in Rockville, Maryland.

Jack Frederick Clement graduated from Haskell High School and enlisted in the Army Air Corps where he received the Distinguished Flying Cross and Air Medal with clusters. He served during the Korean Conflict. Jack married Maxine Whidden. They have one daughter and now live in Orlando, Florida.

The contributor of this article, Barbara Clement Durossette, lives in Haskell, Oklahoma. Her two children, David and Suzanne, are also graduates of Haskell Schools.

It is a very common thing for me to meet people in Haskell or Muskogee County and have them stop and say, "I still think of your mother and dad and miss them." I think that is a lovely , fitting tribute to Fred and Miriam Clement.





#### BOOK NOTES

Recent additions in the Grant Foreman Room include the following interesting items:

- Lifeline: The Action Guide to Adoption Search, by Virgil L. Klunder (1991) provides step-by-step guide to finding the parents of adopted children. The instructions are also directly applicable to genealogical research in general. Among other points covered is the list of Social Security codes broken down by state.
- Register of Graduates and Former Cadets of the United States Military Academy, (1980)(Gift of Jackie Kolinski). The index in the front provides the number in order of graduation for each graduate. From the first graduate in 1802, each graduate's career is briefly outlined. A bonus for the genealogist is the "Genealogical Succession" table, located in the front after the index, gives the relationship of subsequent graduates to ancestors and decendants.
- The Huguenots of Colonial South Carolina, by Arthur Henry Hirsch (1928). This original edition was earlier withdrawn, but after rebinding has been returned to the shelf.
- Mexican War Index to Pension Files, 1886 1926, vol. 9. This continues the series of volumes indexing Mexican War pensions. This was a gift but the name of the donor wasn't noted at the time.
- Tri-County Genealogy, vol. 6, no. 3 (Fall, 1991) is a quarterly issue of the Tri-County Genealogical Society of Marvell, Arkansas. The society covers the counties of Lee, Monroe and Phillips. Each issue is indexed.
- The Making of Pennsylvania, by Sydney George Fisher (1896, 1908 ed.) contains a good breakdown by immigrant groups of those who made Pensylvania "one of the greatest of American states." The index is a welcomed appendix even though it is not an every-name index.
- Over the last few months, many volumes have been sent out to be rebound. Titles with new covers to lengthen their usefulness include:
