JACKSON - EBERLE - TERRY - WISDOM FAMILIES

In this quarterly, the ancestor charts of Zeb JACKSON, Jr. are found. They include the JACKSON, EBERLE, TERRY, and WISDOM families.

The following information concerns the maternal great grandfather of Zeb JACKSON, Colonel Dew Moore WISDOM and his wife, Anna TERRY WISDOM. The WISDOMS came to Muskogee from Ft. Smith, Arkansas. They died in Muskogee.

Colonel Dew M. WISDOM was a native of Tennessee, born 13 February 1836 in Madison County, North Carolina.

Throughout his youth, Colonel WISDOM resided in Prudy, Tennessee. He was afforded excellent educational privileges and in 1857 he was graduated with distinction in the literary department of Cumberland University at Lebanon, Tennessee.

He became proficient in the languages, reading Greek, Latin and French with the greatest facility. He was also a student in the law school of Cumberland University for five months and at the time of the beginning of the Civil War, he was practicing law at Purdy.

At the beginning of the hostilities, he was chosen a member of the constitutional convention; however, the convention was never called.

He then cast his lot with the Confederate forces, becoming first lieutenant of the company of which John V. WRIGHT was captain.

When his superior was made the Colonel of the 13th Tennessee Confederate regiment, Mr. WISDOM succeeded to the captaincy by the unanimous vote of the company, and under his command, his company participated in the battles of Bellmont and Shiloh. He was wounded twice at Bellmont and his injuries were severe. He later served General ROWDY as cavalryman and fought in many spirited engagements under that Confederate leader. He was afterwards transferred to General FORREST'S command and for two or three years served as a colonel under the "Wizard of the Saddle."

In the battle of Harrisburg, near Tupelo, Mississippi, he was again wounded. Colonel WISDOM led the Tennessee troops in the storm of Fort Pillow and was in many other engagements of importance, loyally defending the cause in which he believed.

After the war, Colonel WISDOM went to Iuka, Mississippi, where he resided with his wife whom he had married in 1862.

His wife, Annie TERRY, was the daughter of Wiley B. and Mary GOOCH TERRY. Annie and Dew had 4 children, William D., James Fentress, Terry and Lucille.

Colonel WISDOM was elected a member of the state senate of Mississippi and for one term served in the upper house of the legislature.

In 1868, he became owner and editor of the Tribune in Jackson, Mississippi. The Tribune was a leading journal, which he published in the interests of Democracy for 12 years, after which it was consolidated with the Jackson Sun.

In 1878 he became clerk of the master chancery court of Madison County, where he served for twelve consecutive years.

In 1882 he moved to Fort Smith, Arkansas and became identified with journalism by becoming part owner of the Fort Smith Arrow. He was the political editor and one of the most stalwart advocates of Democracy in the state.

In 1885, Colonel WISDOM was appointed by president Cleveland to the position of chief clerk at Union Agency in Muskogee, having jurisdiction over the nations. In 1893 he was appointed Indian Agent of the Union Agency and served in that capacity for six years. He then resigned on account of the change of administration in Washington.

On 3 May 1900, Colonel WISDOM was elected mayor of Muskogee, his administration being business like and progressive. His remaining years were passed in the practice of law.

Colonel WISDOM had been ill several months before his death. His wife, two sons, his daughter Lucille EBERLE, son-in-law Charles EBERLE, and his brother John L. WISDOM of Jackson, Tennessee were with him at his death. His son, J. Fentress WISDOM was not present, but was on his way to the city from Kentucky.

WISDOM died 4 November 1905. The funeral service was held at the WISDOM residence, 518 Columbus Avenue and burial was in Greenhill Cemetery.

ANNA TERRY WISDOM

These extracts were taken from the obituary of Mrs. Anna TERRY WISDOM.

Mrs. Anna TERRY WISDOM, wife of the late Colonel Dew M. WISDOM, passed away at her home Monday morning. Mrs. WISDOM was the daughter of Mary GOOCH TERRY and Wiley Blount TERRY. Her father was a wealthy merchant and planter from Eastport, Mississippi, where Anna was born 3 April 1839.

She entered into the cause of the Confederacy with the generous zeal that characterized her throughout her life. At her own expense, she equipped a company of troops, who proudly called themselves the "ANNA TERRY GUARDS," in honor of their fair young patroness.

On 8 January 1862, she was married to Captain Dew M. WISDOM, a gallant young officer of the 13th Tennessee Regiment.

The defeat of the southern cause, and the destruction of property changed circumstances, bringing to her, as to so great a multitude of the south, the entire readjustment of life and a demand for courage no less than the war itself had required.

Anna WISDOM was a woman of education and a true southern belle. Petite of form with the vivacity of manner that showed her French ancestry through the finest strain of American blood, that of the exiled Huguenots, she never grew old in heart, courage or interests.

After the war, she went to live in Jackson, Tennessee where her husband held various offices of public honor and trust.

From there, the family moved to Fort Smith, Arkansas in the days when that city seemed destined to become the metropolis of the southwest. Her husband became part owner in a newspaper there.

In 1885 the family moved to Muskogee, Oklahoma when Colonel WISDOM accepted the job of chief clerk at the Indian Agency. Since that time, the framily identified with Muskogee history and interests.

Although very fond of social events, Anna WISDOM was devoted to her church, home and family. She died 21 January 1907. Funeral services were held in the Grace Episcopal Church. Interment was in Greenhill Cemetery.

The 3 sons of Anna and Dew WISDOM were quite prominent in Muskogee business. Daughter, Lucille WISDOM EBERLE was married to Charles H. EBERLE, the county's first Registrar of Deeds. Anna Terry EBERLE was one of the daughters of Lucille and Charles EBERLE, and the mother of Zeb JACKSON, Jr.

The JACKSON family has been in business in Muskogee since 1901 when Ulysses L. JACKSON established the firm of U.L. JACKSON and SON.




