VETERAN DIES

D. A. Rogers, Who Heard Lincoln-Douglas Debate, Was Pioneer of City



D.A. Rogers

David Anson Rogers, 87, witness to historic episodes preceding and during the Civil war and a resident of Muskogee for more than 20 years, died at a hospital here early yesterday after an illness of about a week.

As boy of 12 years, in October, 1858, he was interested in a game of leap frog than in hearing Abraham Lincoln and Stephen A Douglas engage in one of the debates which is credited with having rather Lincoln, made Douglas, the Civil president.

Then as a boy of 16 years, he fought with the Union forces as a volunteer from Illinois in the operations against Vicksburg, Miss.

During his more than years' residence in Muskogee, Mr. Rogers looked after the property interests of Raymond, former federal and a resident during here recent years of Watseka, Ill. Mr. Rogers and Judge Raymond were boyhood playmates.

Mr. Rogers was a native of Illinois, having been reared in Washington of that state. It was there during his boyhood that intersectional bitterness flamed at his highest, with the then Senator Stephen A. Douglas and Abraham Lincoln recognized as leaders of conflicting schools of thought as to the settlement of the slavery question.

It was in 1858 that the episodes credited by historians with having changed the course of national history were enacted. Douglas then was seeking reelection as United States senator from Illinois with Lincoln as his opponent, and they engaged in a series of seven joint debates on issues of the campaign.

One of the debates was held at Metamora, Ill., within 12 miles of Rogers' home, and he, then 12 years old, accompanied several grown persons to the scene. Rogers frequently told of the huge crowd which had assembled and of having noticed the sharp physical contrast between the short, chunky Douglas and the tall Lincoln.

Mr. Rogers related that he occasionally crowded toward the platform to listen to a few words of the debate, but admitted with amusement that he was more interested in a game of leap frog that boys had arranged outside the crowd.

As a boy of 12, Mr. Rogers told that he was a "Douglas democrat," but he became a sincere admirer of Lincoln and during later years, accumulated a sizeable collection of articles relating to him.

Douglas, at the time, was generally considered the victor in the debates as he was reelected to the senate. But Mr. Rogers recounted that history now agrees that in satisfying the Illinois electorate with his stand on the slavery issues, he so dissatisfied others of the free states as to pave the way for his defeat and Lincoln's election as president in 1860.

Following the outbreak of the war, Mr. Rogers enlisted with Company G, 6th Illinois infantry on June 2, 1862.

At that time, Union operations in the west centered in the effort to gain control of the Mississippi, in which Vicksburg was the key, so as to cut the Confederacy in two. The first move, commanded by Admiral Farragut, occupied the summer and part of the autumn of 1862 and Mr. Rogers was a participant throughout. The movement, though unsuccessful, was followed by a second siege which resulted in the surrender of Vicksburg on July 4 and perhaps the hardest of the early blows of the war suffered by the Confederacy.

Rogers completed his term of enlistment in October, 1862 and was discharged.

During the years that followed until the time of his removal, Rogers engaged in railroad work, serving as agent at various points in Illinois.

During his residence here, he had made his home in an apartment in the Harris building, one of the holdings of Judge Raymond.

Mr. Rogers is survived by a sister in Fairbury, Ill. and by a nephew.

CIVIL WAR VETERAN, 85 DIES IN HOSPITAL HERE

William W. Fink Dies At Soldiers' Memorial. Conduct Funeral Services This Afternoon

William W. Fink, 85 year old Civil war veteran of 907 South D street, died at the Veterans' bureau hospital here at 3:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon following a major operation.

Mr. Fink had been ill for the past two years. Recently the Veterans' bureau decided that veterans of the Civil war were entitled to treatment at bureau hospitals. Mr. Fink's condition became critical Sunday night, so he was taken to the government hospital and placed upon the operating table. he failed to rally from the operation.

Mr. Fink served under General Philip Sheridan during the Civil War with Company D of the 44th Illinois infantry.

He lived in Muskogee for the past 17 years, obtaining employment as a cabinet maker when he first came to this city. His wife died several years ago. He is survived by 3 sons.

Gritts

The Gritts community, sometimes called Gritts Hill was settled shortly after Walter Webber come to La Casscade in 1829. La Casscade was named by the French, meaning 'Waters Falls'.

The Gritts area was rich in resources. Pecan, Hickory, Black Walnut, Persimmon trees were in abundance. Wild game was plentiful. The soil was good for farming. Coal and salt was later found in the area.

In 1902 Gritts had a population of 100 and had a daily stage and mail run to Webbers Falls.

The following businesses were there then.

A 'General Store - proprietor - Jesse Ross

Blacksmith shop - Franklin Gritts.

Stock Connal - D.N. Canlisle.

Drugs & Groceries - Doctor E.E. Tabor and Son.

A Post office was there from March 21,1896 to Oct. 30,1909.


Inola NEFF, Guy Waters, Bettie Anderson and Steve Cornsilk owned land adjacent to Gritts.

GROUP SEEKING BURIAL PLACES OF CIVIL WAR VETERANS IN STATE


The Muskogee area is the current focus of a statewide effort to register the burial locations of Civil War veterans in Oklahoma.




