STEPS ON NAIL, DIED OF RESULTANT POISON

**Oscar Frick, Muskogee County Farmer, Succumbs After Brief
Illness**

Poison resulting from a nail wound in his foot last night resulted in the death of Oscar Frick, 59 years old, farmer of southeast of Muskogee. He stepped on a nail Friday, October 12, and when the wound became infected was brought to a local hospital for treatment, but the poison already had gained too much headway.

Surviving him are the widow, two children, Oscar, Jr., and Ruth; his mother, Mrs. Charles Frick of Chatanooga; three sisters, Mrs. B.F. Buffington of Chatanooga, Mrs. Nannie Anders of Tulsa and Mrs. Nora Davis of Muskogee and two brothers, C.W. Frick and E.W. Frick of Muskogee.

The body is at the Guipel funeral home pending funeral arrangements. October 20, 1928, page 1

Funeral services for Oscar Fricks, farmer, residing southeast of the city, who died Friday as a result of blood poisoning, will be conducted at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon at Gooseneck Bend, with the Rev. W.H. Cartwright officiating. Burial will be in the Harris cemetery under direction of the Guipel funeral home.

He is survived by his widow, two children, Oscar, Jr., his mother, Mrs. E.C. Fricks of Chattanooga; three sisters, Mrs. B.F. Buffington, Chattanooga; Mrs. Nannie Anders, Tulsa, and Mrs. Nora Davis of Muskogee, and two brothers, C.W. Fricks and E.W. Fricks, both of Muskogee. October 21, 1928, page 3.

Mrs. Della Burrows, 71, died Sunday morning at the home of her son southeast of Muskogee after a lingering illness. She had been a resident of Muskogee County for the past 62 years and was a member of the Methodist church. She is survived by one son, Raymond, of the home and one daughter, Mrs. Floyd Simmons of Allen, Okla.; five grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. Funeral arrangements are incomplete and will be announced later by the Lescher Funeral Home. November 11, 1946, page 2.

Funeral services for James Burrows, 73, who died late Sunday night at the home, Muskogee route 2, following an illness of several days, will be held Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock in the White Church schoolhouse, southeast of the city, with Ike Hensley officiating. Interment will be in Harris cemetery with P.H. Simmons, John Hickey, E. Furr, Mike Berry, Bud Smith and John Breashers serving as pallbearers. Burrows is survived by the widow; a son, Walter Raymond Burrows of Muskogee; a daughter, Mrs. Floyd Simmons of Allen, Okla, five grandchildren, and two brothers, Whit of Tahola, Okla. and Tobe of Wagoner. CENTRAL BAPTIST CHURCH

MUSKOGEE, OKLAHOMA
1904-1947

The books and records of the Central Baptist Church have been kept by individual members. Since many members have moved away and others have died, it is impossible to write a full and complete history of the church. A fire-proof vault is now being installed in the church basement where a complete set of books and records is to be kept.

The present church enrollment consists of one-thousand three-hundred (1300) members. The Sunday School has an enrollment of one-thousand (1000) and the Training Union has two-hundred five (205) members. The W.M.U. Organization has Two-hundred thirty-eight (238) members enrolled.

The Central Baptist Church, from its beginning, has cooperated with all other Baptist Churches in Denominational work. The church has at all times adhered to the New Testament Doctrines and Standards.

CONSTITUTION OF THE CHURCH

In the year 1905, the East Side Baptist Church was organized on East Callahan, and charter members constituted fourteen in number, to wit:

The minutes of the organization are not available, therefore, it has been impossible to state the name of the home church, and whether or not any of these brought church letters, but the church has been recognized by the District Baptist association since the organization.

Prior to this time, A Sunday School had been conducted for a few months in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Bettis, located on "K" Street. The Bettis family had recently moved to Muskogee from the First Baptist Church, Webbers Falls, Oklahoma.

Under the leadership of Rev. James P. Peden, a student at Bacone College, and with the assistance of Brother J.B. Rounds, arrangements were made to move into an abandoned building, known as the canning factory, located on the east side of town.

A call was issued for the purpose of organizing a regular Missionary Baptist Church. Fourteen people who came were considered eligible to become Charter Members. The group united in fellowship and by vote, declared themselves a regular Missionary Baptist Church. By vote, a church covenant was adapted, and it was agreed by all that the church be named the East Side Baptist Church. Rev. J.P. Peden was called to the pastorate. Thus, a new church was launched, a church which was destined to become one of the great Baptist Churches of Oklahoma.

The new church received a gift of a three-room house from Mrs. Bixby. This house was located on Callahan, just east of the Frisco Railroad Tracks.

The church worshipped in this building for several months. Much of the progress of this church was due to the efforts of Brother L.G. Wright and his family. Deacon Art Wright, Mrs. Rachel Cornett, Mrs. Winnie Heckenkemper, and Mrs. Alice Montgomery are active members of the Central Baptist Church at this present date.

Rev. John Warren of Muskogee, was called to the pastorate of the church in 1905. Under his leadership, the lot where the church is now located was procured and the five room cottage was erected, leaving out the wall partitions. This one large room was used for a house of worship. The cottage was located on the back of the lot, leaving room on the part on Eastside Boulevard for the erection of a church building.

Rev. Warren served the church three years and resigned in 1908. Rev. T.F. Coe, of Ryan, Oklahoma, was then called to the pastorate. He served four years. The church progressed rapidly under the ministry of Rev. Coe. Upon the resignation of Rev. Coe, the church called Rev. C. Ross Payne, an young man from Texas. Rev. Payne served the church one year and then resigned to return to Texas.

Rev. E.D. Cameron was called to the church as its pastor in 1914. With the coming of Rev. Cameron, Rev. W.S. Wiley, Field Secretary of the Sunday School Board, with his family, and Rev. L.C. Wolfe, Evangelist of the Home Mission Board, with his family, united with the church. Rev. J.M. Wiley, General Missionary for the State Baptist Convention, and his family had united with the church at a previous date. Thus, the church was given a distinct denominational color.

By vote of the church, its name was changed from the East Side Baptist Church to the Central Baptist Church.

A building campaign was launched. The cottage was sold and moved across the street where it is still used as a residence. A pattern of the new Baptist Church on the corner of 11th and Robinson Streets in Oklahoma City was procured to serve as a model for the new building. The only financial resources were the small salaries of the members, but the building progressed through the faith of these members. The foundation was built and a sub-floor was laid. As the church was without a place of worship, improvised seats were placed on the sub-floor and services were held in the open air. The present building was completed around and over this place of worship.

At the end of four years' service to the church, Rev. Cameron resigned.

Rev. E. G. Butler, former pastor of the First Baptist Church of Holdenville, Oklahoma, and who had been elected to do field work for the Oklahoma Baptist University, was called and accepted the pastorate. Rev. Butler was an unusually strong preacher and there was a splendid growth in the church. Some very fine members were united with the church. Rev. Butler resigned after four years of service to the church.

Rev. B.A. Pugh, a young man from LaGrange College, Missouri, who served as assistant pastor of the First Baptist Church of Joplin, Missouri, under Dr. R.C. Miller, was called and accepted the pastorate.

Rev. Pugh's ministry was fruitful. The Sunday School addition to the church was built under his leadership. He served the church for eight years before resigning. Brother Pugh formed many lasting friendships while in Central Baptist Church.

Dr W.W. Chancellor was called from a pastorate in Oklahoma City. Under his ministry, a home was bought to be used as the church parsonage. The Denton house next door to the church (south) was purchased to be used by the growing Sunday School, which, by now, was larger than at any previous time. Rev. Chancellor led in erecting another Sunday School building just south of the church. Dr. Chancellor served the church five years and then resigned to accept a pastorate in Miami, Oklahoma.

Dr. Pope A. Duncan was next called and moved to the church. Dr. Duncan came to the church from Georgia but had been paster at Wagoner, Oklahoma at a previous date. He served the church two years and then resigned.

Rev. A. Hope Owen, a student from the Louisville Seminary, was then called to the pastorate and served two very acceptable years. Dr. Owen moved to New Mexico because of ill health. Rev. Owen recommended Rev. Paul Cullen, another student from the seminary. Rev. Cullen was then called to the pastorate and served two years before resigning.

Rev. L.O. McCrackin, of North Little Rock, Arkansas, was next called as pastor. He served for three years and then resigned. The church and Sunday School grew steadily under his leadership.

After a short waiting period, Rev. Herbert Boston was called and accepted the call as pastor. Rev. Boston came from a pastorate in Guthrie, Oklahoma. Under the ministry of Rev. Herbert Boston, an electric organ was installed in the church.

In 1943, Rev. George C. Boston was called as pastor of Central Baptist Church, succeeding his brother, Rev. Herbert Boston, who had resigned. Rev. George Boston came from a pastorate of the Baptist Church in Pawhuska, Oklahoma. In 1947, Dr. George Boston was honored by having the degree of Doctor of Divinity bestowed upon him by the Oklahoma Baptist University.

Under the ministry of Dr. George Boston, the church has made steady progress along all lines of Kingdom building. During the latter part of 1946, the church voted to remodel the church building at a cost of twenty-thousand (\$20,000.00) dollars, and to erect a Mission building at a cost of four Thousand (\$4,000.00) dollars, to be located on the corner of Lawrence and Patterson Streets. The Cottage located south of the main building and known as the Trower house was purchased and added to the church property at a cost of four thousand (\$4,000.00) dollars.

A full basement is being built under the main auditorium for additional Sunday School classes.

A new modern front is being built on the main auditorium. This makes it necessary to move and re-lay the corner stone.

The contents of the original corner stone will be re-deposited with the additional history contained herein.

The Building Committee has expressed the hope that the projected improvements will be completed and paid for this year, 1947.

PROBLEM SOLVING THROUGH AN OBITUARY

(Example)

The following obituary is included here for two reasons. First, the Central Baptist Church History is featured in this issue of the quarterly and Mrs. Sidney PARKISON was a member of that church.

Second, a very vital genealogical clue is found in this obituary which might not be found otherwise.

Mrs. Sidney Crittenden PARKISON was a direct descendent of one of the principal chiefs of the Cherokee Nation in Georgia. Relatives who might be searching the Final Indian Rolls for her with the PARKISON or CRITTENDEN surname would not find her.

With the aid of her obituary, one would see that she had been married previous to her marriage to PARKISON. Her daughter and sons listed among her survivors have the surname, NEWTON. With this clue, her name is found on the Cherokee Dawes Roll as number 15918, as she was Sidney NEWTON at the time of enrollment.

Once again, an obituary can solve many problems when no other sources are available.

Mrs. Parkison who died at her home at 6:40 o'clock Sunday evening, was a daughter of Moses and Margaret Crittenden, descendants of the principal chiefs of the Cherokee Nation in Georgia, who came to the Indian Territory along the "Trail of Tears" and made history in the new country.

The Reverend W.W. Chancellor of the Central Baptist church will officiate at the funeral services and burial will be in Greenhill cemetery.

Mrs. Parkison, who came to Muskogee from Tahlequah in 1906, is survived by her husband; three daughters, Miss Agness Newton, Mrs. E.L. Pruitt and Mrs. J.W. Martin of this city; two sons, W.L. Newton and W.M. Newton, both of Muskogee, three stepchildren, one brother, and seven sisters. Three of the sisters are now in Muskogee to arrange for the funeral this afternoon.

Writing a Family History

by Wally Waits*

When I first wrote an article about my family history¹ twenty-one years ago, I chose to use an outline format using alternating numbers and letters because I thought it clearly stated everything a professional genealogist wanted included in a numbering system. I'm here to tell you that looking at thousands of examples has convinced me that *simplicity* and *adaptability* are the two most important aspects a writer should use in choosing how to write their family history. Fortunately, we don't have to reinvent the wheel.

During the past two years, several articles have been written in the National Genealogical Society's Quarterly² which lay out the framework for writing the most important publication you will undertake as a result of your research into your heritage. Your product will be discussed and cussed long afterwards for what you said, what you didn't say, and how you said it. These articles will only help you with the final point, though one will give you some ideas for the first two.

The first, "Numbering Your Genealogy: Sound and Simple Systems³," Joan Curran's article written in 1991, discusses the "Register System" and the improved register system, called the "NGS Quarterly System" for those writing about the descendants of a single couple or person. She also discusses ways of writing ascending genealogies.

The following is a sample using the NGS Quarterly System in my own family history. While using a computer and good printer allows the options of different fonts and type sizes, the same format can be followed with minor variations if a typewriter is used. This is the system I recommend.

SAMPLE:⁴

33. William³ Waits (John C.², Samuel¹) was born about 1822 in Alabama, probably in Shelby County. He married his first cousin on August 1st, 1844 in Lauderdale County, Mississippi. His wife was **Safronia³ Waits** [number 49 below], the daughter of **James² Waits** (Samuel¹) and **Elizabeth Warbington**. Both William and Sophronia died about 1869.

The next important article, entitled "Indexing Family Histories⁵," appeared this year. The authors take you step-by-step through the process of creating a road map to the contents of your family history. In addition, most of the details of how to index enlighten a researcher's passage through the technical questions, e.g., how to handle female names or multiple people with the same name. Having used plenty of volumes with more than one index in the back prompts me to agree that only one index--which incorporates both topical, place and family names--is best.

To a much lesser extent, "Beckwith Improvement: Repairing and Refining compiled Genealogies⁶" demonstrates the problems found in old family histories. If you will compare the final version of the genealogy by the author with the first one on the page two, you will readily see how much easier it is to understand.

Finally, there is the reply to Curran's article which is written by a nationally known genealogist⁷. I can see the value of using a program such as WordPerfect 5.1 to number individuals because the numbers can be changed so easily. There are other programs which will also number, and re-number if necessary, each individual for you; though I confess they do not work as easily as WordPerfect. If you have this program, I encourage you to try it to see what you think. If nothing else, this article will help you understand the reasoning behind numbering people in a family history.

Now you are on your own. I hope you will share with us what you are working on and what techniques and strategies you are using.

The following is extracted from the Press Telegram, Long Beach, CA, 24 march 1993.

Thomas Fulton CROSBY of Long Beach, passed away on March 22, 1993 at the age of 79. He was born to Thomas F. CROSBY, Sr., and the former Ruth M. MOHON in Muskogee Oklahoma on February 20, 1914.

Mr. CROSBY attended Wentworth Military Academy in Lexington, Missouri. He moved to Long Beach in 1931 with his widowed mother and older sister, Ruth Mae CRUTCHFIELD. He married Lucille M. LINDE on March 31, 1939. Survivors are his wife, Lucille and sons, Justice Thomas F. CROSBY, Jr., and John Patrick CROSBY.

From Viola LONG, McKinleyville, California, comes the death certificate of Elizabeth BRAGG. Elizabeth was the wife of Solomon BRAGG, for whom the town of Braggs was named. South Bethel Cemetery was recorded by members of the genealogical society, but there was no death date on Elizabeth's stone. I have not seen a death date for Elizabeth recorded in any other source, thus this information was very welcome. Her death date was 5 November 1913. An obituary could not be found for her. A photocopy of the death certificate of Elizabeth Brand BRAGG is included on the following page.

A Civil War Soldier's stone has been set in Greenhill Cemetery this month. Mr. CROSBY attended Wentworth Military Academy in Lexington, Missouri. He moved to Long Beach in 1931 with his widowed mother and older sister, Ruth Mae CRUTCHFIELD. He married Lucille M. LINDE on March 31, 1939. Survivors are his wife, Lucille and sons, Justice Thomas F. CROSBY, Jr., and John Patrick CROSBY.

From Viola LONG, McKinleyville, California, comes the death certificate of Elizabeth BRAGG. Elizabeth was the wife of Solomon BRAGG, for whom the town of Braggs was named. South Bethel Cemetery was recorded by members of the genealogical society, but there was no death date on Elizabeth's stone. I have not seen a death date for Elizabeth recorded in any other source, thus this information was very welcome. Her death date was 5 November 1913. An obituary could not be found for her. A photocopy of the death certificate of Elizabeth Brand BRAGG is included on the following page.

A Civil War Soldier's stone has been set in Greenhill Cemetery this month. As a result of a query from Missouri, to our society, the inquirer discovered that her ancestor was a Union Soldier and that there was no marker on his grave in the cemetery. After obtaining proper government papers and proving service for her soldier, she was awarded a stone. Now Willis W. FINK has the marker he deserves and it reads "Willis W. Fink, Drummer, Co. D, 44th IL Inf. Civil War. May 28, 1841- Nov 1, 1926.

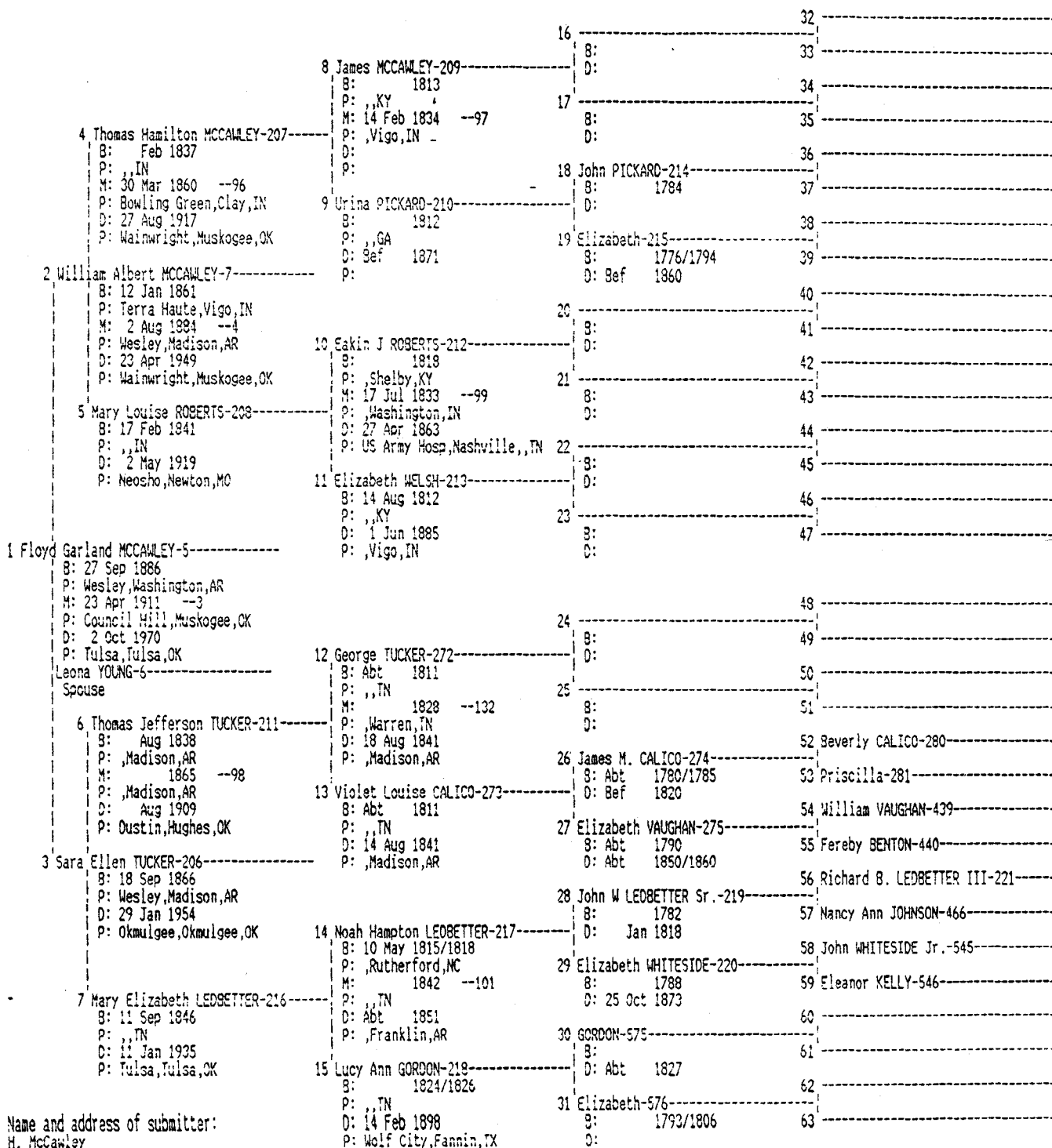
