## Oldest Headstone<sup>1</sup>


This one is found in cemetery near Webbers Falls; Some graves unidentified.

This is the oldest gravestone in the cemetery on the Vann farm, southeast of Webbers Falls. While the cemetery takes its name from the family which has owned the land on which it is located, it was there when Robert Vann first purchased this land in 1882, and has never been used by that family. Many graves are marked only with rude headstones of native rock, with no identification. Many names well known in the Cherokee tribe are to be found on the headstones. The newest grave in the cemetery was placed there only last summer.

# ALTERNATIVES TO CIVIL WAR SEARCHES By Ernie Franklin, Feb 94

Many of us have ancestors that served in the Civil War. When I first found out that my 4th Great Grandfather was a Civil War veteran I was filled with the desire to find out as much as I could. The first clue was furnished by a copy of a deed record that stated Joel Parker Franklin was wounded on August 10, 1861 at the battle of Wilson's Creek. I went the usual search through the National Archives. To do this type of search you must use a GSA FORM 6751 which is available from the National Archives, Washington, D.C. 20408. Because he was a Confederate Soldier and a member of the Missouri State Guard, the National Archives did not have any information on him. They referred me to the Missouri State Archives Records. After a short wait it was confirmed that he was a member of 3rd Division M.S.G. in Clark's command. These records also indicated that he was wounded. really got me wondering. Where did he go? He wasn't in the 1870 Census but his wife was. After a few months of wonder I had the opportunity to visit the Wilson's Creek National Battlefield in Springfield Missouri. The park rangers were very nice and showed me a list of all the soldiers who wounded and killed at Wilson's Creek. was my Grandfather again, listed as wounded. The park offered what I think is a helpful alternative. They took his name and all the information I had and offered to do a search a little later and mail it to me. I returned home and a few weeks later I received a letter stating a record of him had been found in the Missouri State Guard Hospital in Springfield. The information showed that he had died from his wounds on August 17, 1861. It also stated he was most likely buried in the National Cemetery in Springfield in the unmarked Confederate section. This was a good piece of the puzzle that eluded some earlier relatives searches. In summary, remember to search at the actual site of the Civil War battles. You may get lucky.

A note of interest from the Franklin Family Researchers United, Rt 2, Box 212, El Campo, TX 77437. Submitted by Nina M. Martin. While I was working for a funeral home a headstone in a Covington GA cemetery caught my eye. It read, "Remember me as you pass by. As you are now, so once was I. As I am now, you soon will be. Prepare for death and follow me." Underneath the inscription, a previous passerby had scribbled the following in black paint: "To follow you, I'm not content, unless I know which way you went!" ## The Lineage Books of the DAR<sup>1</sup>

From 1890 to 1939 the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution published 166 volumes containing the lineages of accepted members through National Number 160,000 (admitted in April 1921). The set is available in many large libraries<sup>2</sup> around the country having been used by the NSDAR to exchange with other libraries for their publications. It is often the genealogist's first contact with DAR records, which, unfortunately, can lead to problems in further research and documentation of genealogies.

NSDAR recommends that researchers use CAUTION when studying the Lineage Books. As of this writing, the lineages contained in these books are anywhere from 103 to 72 years old. Consequently, there have been at least seventy-two years during which many new sources have become available to researchers. Nearly 600,000 applications for membership in NSDAR have been approved since the last published lineage from 1921. Thousands of corrections have been made to the records in this set during this period. These correction have not been published in supplemental volumes to the Lineage Books, and are therefore available only in the Office of the Registrar General at NSDAR Headquarters in Washington. Corrections are, however, periodically published in DAR Magazine in condensed form, but there is no index to these. The corrected lineages themselves are not published in the magazine, however. Additionally, some older lineages listed in the set, may never have had another applicant associated with it for errors to be detected and corrected. lineages, whether they be those in the Lineage Books or those submitted subsequently to them, should be verified with the Registrar General's office.

Should one wish to correct an inaccurate lineage, please send a letter of explanation and documentation supporting the change to the Corrections Genealogist, Office of the Registrar General, NSDAR, 1776 "D" Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., 20006-5392. Such corrections are welcomed.

The staff genealogists of NSDAR no longer accept lineages cited in the *Lineage Books* as suitable proof for applications by potential new members. In short, the set is useful only for clues to a lineage and should be used very carefully.

All volumes of the *Lineage Books* have been out-of-print for many years. They will not be reprinted in either book form or microform. No copies are available from any office at NSDAR

#### Headquarters.

Although there are major limitations to the validity of information in the Lineage Books, researchers may find valuable clues hidden in the pages of this set of 166 volumes. volume set of indexes was published between 1916 and 1940. in 1980 and several times since then, the Genealogical Publishing Company of Baltimore, Maryland has reprinted this set as Index to the Rolls of Honor in the Lineage Books of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution. This set of books covers volumes 1-160, but not the last six volumes. Copies must be ordered directly form the Genealogical Publishing Company. Volumes 161 to 166 have been indexed in a separate publication: Index of the Rolls of Honor (Ancestor's Index) in the Lineage Books of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution, Volumes  $161-166^4$  [S.l.: s.n.], 1965. This volume is not presently available from a publisher to our knowledge.

In any event, researchers should use this entire set with the greatest of caution. Some information is correct. Other information is completely incorrect. The NSDAR Library has shelved its set of *Lineage Books* away from the main collection, but library users can certainly use the books if they so desire. Anyone inquiring as to their location is warned of the limitations and is referred to the Registrar General's office for current information. We urge librarians and researchers alike to be aware of this situation.

#### MOTHER OF TERRITORY 'BAD MAN', FAMOUS 'CHEROKEE BILL', IS DEAD

Recalls That he Ran Wild in Jail at Fort Smith and Was Disarmed by Henry Starr

"Aunt Elle" Lynch, mother of one of Oklahoma's notorious "bad men" of territorial days, will be buried at 1 o'clock this afternoon in Fort Gibson. Her famous son was Crawford Goldsby, known more widely as "Cherokee Bill," a character often pictured in wild west stories.

Aunt Elle had been a resident of Fort Gibson since early frontier days, but she was at the home of her granddaughter, Maud Surrell, 616 North Fourteenth street, when she died early Sunday morning. It was back in 1870 that Aunt Elle married George Goldsby, a white cavalry man attached to the frontier post of Fort Gibson. One of their children was Crawford.

The Goldsbys moved to the Mexican border when the cavalryman was transferred and there the husband became an intimate of the Mexican insurrecto, Pancho Villa, and was with Villa, in some sort of scrape which caused him to desert the army. Aunt Elle then came back to this neighborhood and married Lynch. In 1924 Aunt Elle was granted a pension when she was able to prove that Goldsby, from whom she had never been divorced, had died in 1921 in the Osage nation, where he had gone after the border escapade had blown over. He had married there and had raised another family, just as Aunt Elle had done at Fort Gibson. Her pension was not granted until after years had been spent attempting to locate Goldsby.

"Cherokee Bill" was the center of many a wild story of territorial times. While he was waiting in jail at Fort Smith to be hanged, having been sentenced to death by Judge Isaac Parker, the "hanging judge," he obtained a gun and ran riot in the prison. It was Henry Starr, bank robber and outlaw and a prisoner there himself who went into Cherokee Bill's cell and took his gun from him. Cherokee Bill was later hanged.

Numerous crimes were laid to him. Among them was the murder of the father of Aunt Elle's granddaughter at whose home the aged woman died. Ike Rogers, negro deputy marshal, was the one who arrested Cherokee Bill. The two were friendly, so the story goes, and while standing in front of a fireplace, at Cherokee Bill's home, Rogers struck him over the head with a poker, slipped the handcuffs on him while he was unconscious, and took him to Fort Smith. Feeling among Cherokee Bill's relatives towards Rogers was none too cordial and one of them shot him to death as he stepped from the train at Fort Gibson.

Ellen Lynch, born 16 February 1859, died 14 November 1932, is buried in Section B, Lot 136 in Cherokee National Cemeter, Ft. Gibson, OK. William Lynch is buried in Section B, Lot 137.






