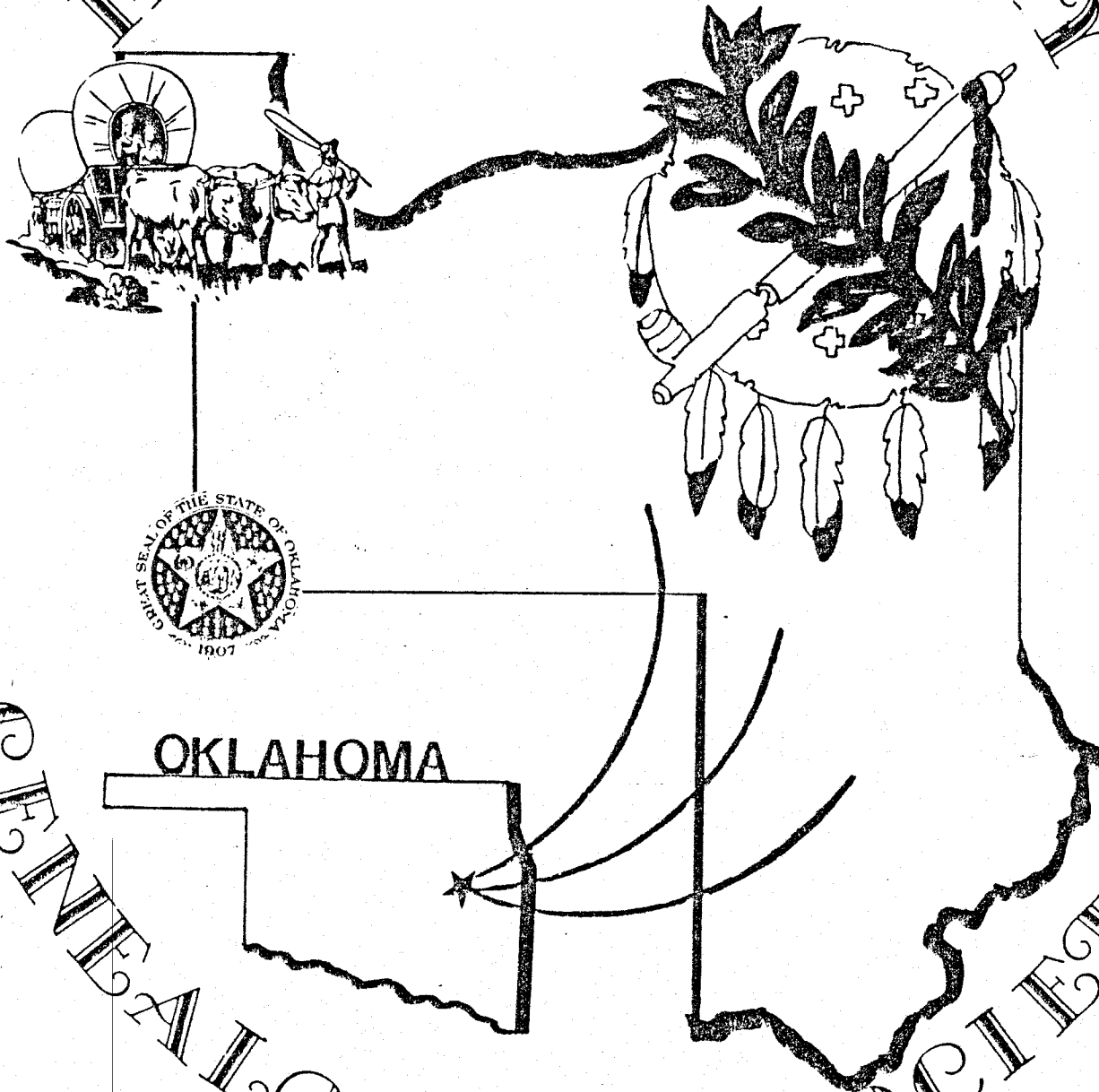

JULY 8, 1909

CLERK WELLS HAS A BUSY DAY AND CHRISTENS NEW LICENSE BOOK.

BREAKING THE MONOTONY OF THE LAST FEW DAYS, CLERK WELLS YESTERDAY ISSUED FOUR LICENSES TO WED, OPENING UP A BRAND NEW LICENSE RECORD BOOK IN CELEBRATION AND COMMEMORATION OF THE OCCASION.

ELIJAH L. HAYES, AGE 20, HAD PERMISSION FROM HIS FATHER TO MARRY MRS. VIRGIE PRUITT, AGE 18, BOTH OF FORT GIBSON. THE BRIDE, WHO LOOKS YOUNG FOR HER AGE, ENTERS THE BONDS OF MATRIMONY FOR THE SECOND TIME, THE FIRST MARRIAGE BEING ANNULLED NOV. 4TH, 1907, WHEN SHE WAS GRANTED A DIVORCE FROM HER FIRST HUSBAND, HIRAM PRUITT.

EDWARD HAYES, 23, AND AMANDA BROWN, 18, OF BRAGGS, WERE ACCOMODATED(SIC) WITH THE NECESSARY PAPERS.

HARRY WINGFIELD, 20, AND NORA HELVY, BOTH OF MUSKOGEE WERE GRANTED A LICENSE.

THE LAST OF THE FOUR COUPLES TO APPEAR WERE THOS. MCINTIRE, 21, AND LENA ABBOTT, 17, BOTH OF MUSKOGEE.



RECYCLING GRAVES

GERMANS ARE NOW TAKING ENVIRONMENTAL CONSCIOUSNESS TO THEIR GRAVES. THOUSANDS OF ELABORATE, SCULPTURAL FUNERARY MONUMENTS ARE NO LONGER MAINTAINED BY RELATIVES OF THE DECEASED, AND FUNDS TO PRESERVE THEM ARE NOT AVAILABLE. TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM, ONE CEMETERY DIRECTORY HAS BEGUN RECYCLING THE MONUMENTS, REPORTS THE GERMAN INFORMATION CENTER. PURCHASERS PAY TO HAVE THE MONUMENTS RESTORED AND REINSCRIBED AND THEN CAN USE THEM TO COMMEMORATE THEIR OWN DEAD.

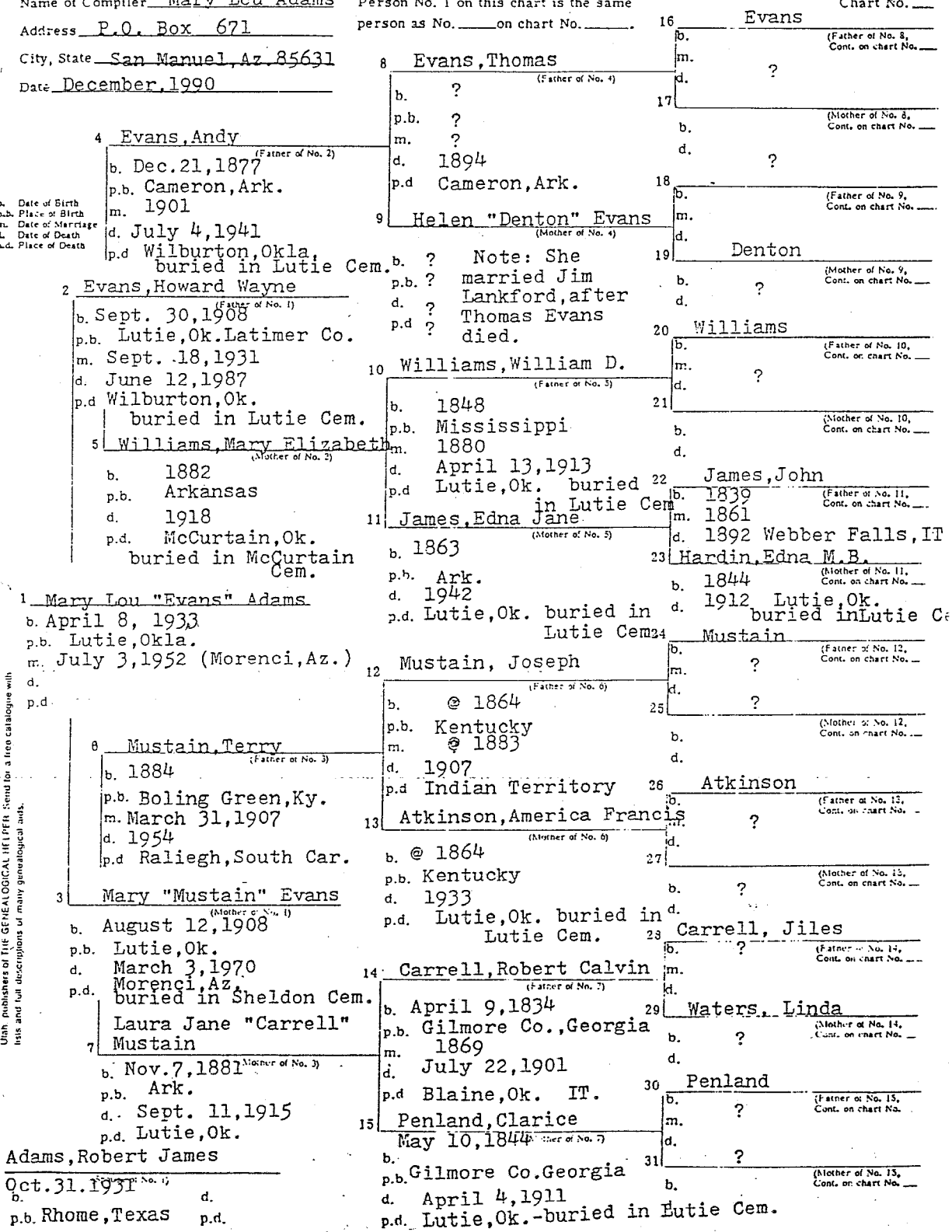
