Posse in Pursuit of Porum Bandits North of Meeker

Trail of Holdup Men is Followed Easily but They Continue Speedy Flight FACE VOLLEY OF SHOTS

Fired on by McIntosh Officers And by Postmaster; Get \$3800 in Cash

SAY BANDITS' LOCATED - A telephone call from a deputy sheriff at Prague at 11 o'clock last night stated that V.S. Cannon, sheriff of Muskogee county, and Ery Kelley, former sheriff of McIntosh county, had followed the three bandits who robbed the bank at Porum yesterday morning to near Coffeyville, Kan., knew who the men were, and would have them in jail by morning. Their hiding place is known, it is said, and officers are closing in on them, to make the arrests.

Muskogee county officers, when last heard from last night, had driven north from Meeker, toward Tulsa, hot on the trail of three men who held up the American State Bank at Porum yesterday morning.

It was thought by Sheriff V.S. Cannon, leading the posse, that the bandits had headed for Tulsa and probably would go on through there possibly to Coffeyville, Kan. The posse planned to continue the chase until the three were captured or the trail lost.

Robbery Is Successful - The robbery, daringly but successfully executed, apparently was the work of experienced bank bandits.

About 10 o'clock two men, both plainly dressed and unmasked, entered the bank, while a third bandit remained outside in a Chevrolet car they had stolen in Shawnee, and kept the motor running. At the point of guns, they forced V.C. Mix, janitor, and three customers to lie face downward on the floor while Dyton Dunaway, cashier, complied with the command to put all the bank's cash, some \$3800, into a canvas sack.

From his office, R.B. Patton, bank president, saw the bandits enter the bank and stage the robbery. He could easily have shot both of them, but he had never kept a pistol in his office. He slipped out a side door, and ran to a neighboring building to borrow a gun, but returned to find that the bandits had left, taking practically all of the bank's cash.

A posse was soon organized, and started after the bandit car, but was temporarily thrown off the trail when the trio drove through the residence district and out of town. As they were leaving the city, E.A. Plunkett, postmaster at Porum, took a pot-shot at them with a .32 caliber revolver when they passed the postoffice, but missed. They did not return his fire but sped out in the residence section where the trail was lost.

Speed Toward Checotah - Shortly afterward, a traveling man drove into town, and said that he had met the bandit car, traveling at a high speed, and headed for Checotah. According to his story the car was traveling at such speed that it narrowly missed turning over on the dirt road when he passed it. V.S. Cannon, sheriff of Muskogee county, had driven to Porum on business, and arrived shortly after the robbery. He immediately called John McQuillan, sheriff of McIntosh county at Eufaula, who arrived in Checotah just after the bandit car had passed through the town.

A race between the bandits and McQuillan and his car of officers followed, witnesses saying that both cars were going 75 miles an hour, the officers gaining. McQuillian caught up with the fugitives just west of Checotah, and engaged them in a gun battle, with the honors about even.

H.J. Qufall, former street commission here and now in the maintenance department of U.S. highway 266, was a witness to the battle.

In the exchange of lead, McQuillan shot the rear glass from the Chevrolet, while he received a bullet through the radiator of his car, a damage which probably accounted for his inability to keep up the chase.

Continuing their flight, the bandits drove toward Oklahoma City, where they were traced by Sheriff Cannon and Erv Kelly, former sheriff of McIntosh county who has built a statewide reputation for his ability to keep on a trail until he has "got his man." They drove to Meeker, a small town north of Shawnee, and then turned north. It is thought that they will drive through Tulsa, and toward Coffeyville, Kan., or else separate and hide in the Osage hills around Pawhuska.
