

OLD INDIAN TREATY BOUNDARY



MARRIAGE RECORDS OF THE INDIAN TERRITORY

Marriage records of Oklahoma are recorded in the office of the Court Clerk located in the various counties of the state. Prior to statehood (1907), marriages of white citizens in that part of the state known as Indian Territory were recorded in the various recording districts of the United States Federal Court. A number of the court clerk offices contain these records.

The following table shows a list of the counties in which these records are kept, the county seat, number of volumes in the office, and the period of time covered:

The Act of March 1, 1889 (25 Stat. 783), established a United States court in the Indian Territory with jurisdiction extended over the Indian Territory as follows, to wit:

North by the State of Kansas, east by the States of Missouri and Arkansas, south by the State of Texas, and west by the State of Texas and the Territory of New Mexico.

The Act of May 2, 1890 (26 Stat. 81), divided Indian Territory into three divisions:

Division 1 - Consists of country occupied by the Indian tribes in the Quapaw Indian Agency and all that part of the Cherokee country east of the ninety-sixth meridian and all of the Creek country; and the place for holding said court therein shall be at Muskogee.

Division 2 - Consists of the Choctaw country, and the place for holding said court shall be at South McAlester.

Division 3 - Consists of the Chickasaw and Seminole countries, and the place for holding said court shall be at Ardmore.

The clerk and deputy clerks of said United States court shall have the power within their respective divisions to issue marriage licenses or certificates and to solemnize marriages. They shall keep copies of all marriage licenses or certificates issued by them, and a record book in which shall be recorded all licenses or certificates after the marriage has been solemnized, and all persons authorized by law to solemnize marriages shall return the license or certificate, after executing the same, to the clerk or deputy clerk who issued it, together with his return thereon.

The Act of March 1, 1895 (28 Stat. 693) provided in part: That the territory known as the Indian Territory, now within the jurisdiction of the United States court in said Territory, is hereby divided into three judicial districts, to be known as the northern, central, and southern districts.

Northern District shall consist of all the Creek country, all of the Seminole country, all of the Cherokee country, all of the country occupied by the Indian tribes in the Quapaw Indian Agency, and the town site of the Miami Townsite Company, and the places of holding courts in said district shall be at Vinita, Miami, Tahlequah and Muskogee.

Central District shall consist of all the Choctaw country, and the places of holding courts in said district shall be at South McAlester, Atoka, Antlers, and Cameron.

Southern District shall consist of all the Chickasaw country, and the places of holding courts in said district shall be at Ardmore, Purcell, Pauls Valley, Ryan and Chickasha.

The Act of March 24, 1902 (32 Stat. 90), changed the boundaries between southern and central districts as follows:

That all that portion of the Chickasaw Nation east of the Washita River, from the junction of Island Bayou and the Red River, up the Red River to the mouth of the Washita River, and up said river to the mouth of Butcherpen Creek, and north up said Butcherpen Creek to the township line between townships four and five south, in range seven east, thence along said township line to the boundary line between the Choctaw and Chickasaw nations, in rage eight east, shall be added to the central judicial district of the Indian Territory.

Indian Territory western judicial district was created by the Act of May 27, 1902 (32 Stat. 245), as follows:

Sec. 8. That the part the northern district of the Indian Territory consisting of the Creek country, the Seminole country, and all that portion of the Cherokee and Choctaw nations included in the following-described boundaries, to wit: Commencing at the northeast corner of the Creek Nation and running east on the line between townships nineteen and twenty, to its intersection with the dividing line between ranges twenty and twenty-one, east, thence south on said line to its intersection with the Arkansas River, thence down the Arkansas River to its

intersection with the Canadian River, thence up the Canadian River to its intersection with the dividing line between ranges twenty and twenty-one, east, thence south to the intersecting line between townships seven and eight, thence west on the intersecting line between townships seven and eight to the Creek Nation, be, and the same is hereby, made the western district in said Territory, and the places of holding courts in said western district shall be Muscogee, Wagoner, Sapulpa, Wewoka, Eufaula and Okmulgee. . . That the clerk's office at Vinita shall also be the recorder's office for the northern district, except that the clerk's office at Miami shall continue to be the recording office for the Quapaw Indian Agency as now provided by law. . . .

The Act of February 19, 1903 (32 Stat. 841), set places of recording instruments of writing as follows:



POTATOES WORTH WEIGHT IN GOLD

Phoenix Reporter Finds They Will Buy Shaves, Tobacco and Pay Car Fare

Potatoes "worth their weight in gold," are legal tender in Muskogee. The Monroe, Wis. barkeeper who accepted a potato in payment for two glasses of beer does not value them more highly than do the merchants of this city.

Under instructions from the city editor, a Phoenix reporter, a market basket filled with potatoes under his arm, set forth on a shopping trip Friday afternoon. The basket was his purse, the potatoes his currency. He was to attempt to purchase the thing that he would ordinarily buy during the course of the afternoon and to offer potatoes for everything for which he would ordinarily tender cash.

It is the reporter's custom to be shaved each afternoon in the Wetzell barber shop. So to the shop he went, climbed into a chair without a word and ordered a shave. When the barber had finished he tendered the proprietor three potatoes, valuing them at five cents each. "Hen" Wetzell accepted them without a word. He apparently knew their true value, however, for he called out as the reporter went through the door, "you've got one more shave coming."

At the P & H store, "Jimmy" Mason accepted two potatoes in payment for a ten-cent can of tobacco. One Broadway motion picture show declined to accept them, but another one a half block away, took them with the remark that they would like to get more. A book store accepted four in payment for a Cosmopolitan magazine.

With three potatoes left the reporter boarded an Elgin Avenue car line and started home. He handed the motorman a potato in lieu of his fare. The motorman never so much as blinked. As far as anyone could tell, he had been accustomed for years to accepting potatoes instead of nickels. He stuck the spud in one of her pockets, dropped a nickel, apparently his own, in the cash box and collected the fare of the next man.

Hayes for the approval of a deed dated 14th day of April, 1909 executed by Esther Girty, wary Girty, Peggie Girty, and Jennie Girty to said J. E. Hayes, conveying the Alex Girty alatment situate in Muskogee County, Oklahoma, described as follows, to-wit:

The east half of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter and the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter of section seventeen, township eleven north, and range twenty one east, containing thirty acres more or less; and also the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter and the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of section seventeen, township eleven north, and range twenty one east and the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter of section nine, township ten north, and range nineteen east, containing sixty acres more or less.

And the evidence and argument of counsel having been heard and said deed having been examined the court finds that said land was allotted and patented to said Alex Girty, a Cherokee Indian, who died about the year 1906 or 1907 a resident of that part of the Indian Territory now Muskogee County, Oklahoma, leaving the said grantors who are full blood Cherokee Indians and Jim Crapoe, Collin Grapoe, Buck Girty, and Martin Girty his heirs. That this court has full and complete jurisdiction of the subject matter hereof and of the estate of said Alex Girty, deceased. That the consideration paid for the interest of said grantors, Esther Girty, Mary Girty, peggie Girty, and Jennie Girty was \$400.00, and same is a fair and reasonable consideration and said deed ought to be approved.

IT IS THEREORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED That the said deed be, and the same is hereby approved




